






1.2 Defence, National Security and Terrorism

Indo-French Joint Exercise Shakti 2019

- The joint military exercise of India and French troops is to be held between 31st October 2019 and 13th November 2019.
- It is a biennial exercise conducted alternately in India and France. The exercise is to be conducted at the Foreign Training Node at Mahajan Field Firing Range, Rajasthan.

Highlights

■ The exercise will focus on Counter Terrorism operations in a semi-desert terrain under United Nations Mandate

India and Saudi Arabia to Hold First Joint Naval Drills

- India and Saudi Arabia will conduct their first-ever joint naval exercises in the first week of March next year, as the two sides agreed to enhance their cooperation in defence and security areas.
- The Gulf Kingdom wants to deepen its maritime cooperation with India in the western Indian Ocean, which constitutes busy and sensitive shipping routes such as the Red Sea, the Gulf of Aden, the Arabian Sea, the Gulf of Oman, and the Persian Gulf.

Rudrashila-The White-Water Rafting Expedition

- At the Jodhpur Military station, the white-water rafting expedition called the "Rudrashila" was flagged in by Lt General VS Sreenivas. It was undertaken by the Kalidhar Battalion.
- The team will also spread awareness on social issues of "Swachh Bharat" campaign and "Preservation of river ecosystem". The expedition will start from Rudhraprayag and end in Rishikesh.
- It is considered to be the most difficult and dangerous rapids in the mighty Ganges river.

Rudrashila

- The name Rudrashila is framed from the Rudraprayag tributary of the Ganges river.
- It originates in the mountains of Uttarkhand.

Operation 'Maa'

■ It was a quiet humane operation of approaching "Maa" (mother) launched by Kashmir-based XV Army Corps that saw around 50 Kashmiri youths return to normal life this year, after abandoning the terror groups they had joined.

First BIMSTEC Ports Conclave at Visakhapatnam

- The **Ministry of shipping** is hosting the first ever **BIMSTEC Ports' Conclave.**
- The Bay of Bengal Initiative for **Multispectral Technical and Economic Cooperation** is an international organization that involves South East Asian and South Asian countries.

GRSE delivers Fast Patrol Vessel (FPV) ICGS Annie Besant to Indian Coast Guard

- Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers Ltd (GRSE) delivered Fast Patrol Vessel (FPV) ICGS Annie Besant to Indian Coast Guard (ICGS) in Kolkata, West Bengal.
- This is second in the series of five such FPVs being built by GRSE for Indian Coast Guard and the 101st warship to be delivered by shipyard.

About ICGS Annie Besant

- It is a medium-range vessel with 50 metres in length, 7.5 metres in width and displacement of nearly 308 tonnes.
- It is designed for a maximum speed of 34 knots with an endurance of over 1,500 nautical miles.

DRDO's Igniter Complex Inaugurated

- A Defense Research Development Organization (DRDO) Igniter Complex was inaugurated at High Energy Materials Research Laboratory (HEMRL), Pune.
- The main purpose of the laboratory is to design, process, evaluate ignition systems for any kind of DRDO projects.

HEMRL

- HEMRL develops rocket, pyrotechnic devices, gun propellants, high-explosive systems. Ignition is the crucial phenomenon in all these systems.
- HEMRL had developed ignition system for Prithvi, Agni, Nag, Akash, Pinaka, etc. It has also transferred the technology to Ordnance factory, Pune.

India-Uzbekistan 1st-ever joint military exercise Dustlik-2019 begins

- The first-ever India-Uzbekistan joint military exercise Dustlik-2019 begin at Chirchiq Training Area near Tashkent, Uzbekistan.
- The exercise, which will be focused on counter-terrorism.
- During the exercise, an Indian Army contingent will train along with Uzbekistan Army.

SCOJtEx-2019: Shanghai Cooperation Organization Joint Exercise

- Union Home Minister Amit Shah will inaugurate the Shanghai Cooperation Organization Joint Exercise on Urban Earthquake Search and Rescue-'SCOJtEx-2019' in New Delhi.
- The four day exercise will be held from 4-7 November 2019. The joint exercise is being hosted by **National Disaster Response Force (NDRF).**
- The SCOJtEx will be followed by a meeting between SCO experts and officials of ministries responsible for prevention as well as elimination of emergency situations.

Def Connect: Ministry of Defence showcases the innovations of iDEX initiative

- Ministry of Defence (MoD) is organizing the "Def Connect" event on November 11, 2019.
- The main objective of the event is to showcase the accomplishments of iDEX-Innovations for Defence Exellence.

ReSAREX-2019: ICG conducts Regional level Search and Rescue Workshop and Exercise-2019

- The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) conducted the 'Regional Level Search and Rescue Workshop and Exercise 2019': ReSAREX-19 off Goa coast.
- The two-day event was organized by Coast Guard District Headquarters-11 (Goa) to test efficiency and preparedness of ICG.

About ReSAREX- 19

The exercise comprised of a search and rescue workshop and table top exercise, followed by a search and rescue exercise at sea.

Tiger TRIUMP: First Tri-services amphibious exercise between India and US

■ India and US are to jointly conduct Tiger TRIUMP, the first ever tri-services amphibious exercise. It is to be conducted in Visakhapatnam and Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh. It includes field training and events that simulate humanitarian assistance in disaster times. The event will also hold simulations in moving disaster relief forces from ship to shore.

Roar of the sea: Naval Exercise between Qatar and India

- A three-day naval exercise, Za'ir-Al-Bahr (Roar of the Sea) is being conducted between November 17 and November 21, 2019 between the Indian and Qatar Naval Forces.
- The aim of the exercise is to enhance interoperability between the naval forces.

Indian Navy and Indonesian Navy Bilateral Maritime Exercise Samudra Shakti Progresses in the Bay of Bengal

■ INS Kamorta, an Anti-Submarine Warfare Corvette, is exercising with Indonesian Warship KRI Usman Harun, a multi-role Corvette in the Bay of Bengal as part of the ongoing Indian Navy Indonesian Navy Bilateral Exercise Samudra Shakti from 06 Nov to 07 Nov 19.

Rajnath Sigh to attent Maitree Diwas celebrations in Arunachal Pradesh

- Defence minister Rajnath Singh will visit Arunachal Pradesh today to attend the Maitree Diwas celebrations at Tawang.
- Maitree Diwas (Civil-Military Friendship) will be celebrated for two days at Gyalwa Tsangyang Gyatso High Altitude Stadium Tawang.
- This will be the 11th edition of Maitree Diwas which celebrates civil-military bonhomie in the area.
- Rajnath Singh will also inaugurate sisseri River Bridge and National Highway-52 in East Siang District tomorrow.

Exercise Indra 2019 to be held in December

- Exercise Indra 2019, a joint tri-service exercise between India and Russia, has been scheduled to be held in December 2019.
- In the exercise, the mechanized contingents, fighter and transport aircraft and ships of the armed forces of India and Russia will be participating.

India completes Agni II test fire successfully

- India conducted its first night trial of **AGNI II** missile successfully.
- It is the first night trial being tested by the country.
 The nuclear capable missile was tested at the Abdul Kalam Island of Odisha Coast.

Highlights

- The missile was developed by DRDO (Defence Research and Development Organization)
- The surface-to-surface medium range nuclear capable missile was tested by the **Strategic Forces of the Indian Army.**
- The missile is capable of striking range of **2,000 km**.
- It can carry payload of **1,000 kg** and launch a weight of 17 tonnes. It is **20 meters** long and is a two-stage missile.
- It is an IRBM (Integrated Range Ballistic Missile) and has already been inducted into the armed forces

AGNI Missile

- Agni II missile is a part of series of Agni missile with a range of 2,000 km. The range of Agni I is 700 km, Agni III is 3,000 km.
- The first test firing of Agni II missile was done in 1999. In 2010, the first test fire of nuclear capable Agni II ballistic missile was conducted successfully.

DRDO to double ASTRA's range

The DRDO recently announced that DRDO (Defence Research Development Organization) is to increase the range of ASTRA airto-air missiles. India is one of the few countries to own a successful BMD-Ballistic Missile Defence programme.

ASTRA

■ Astra (Sanskrit word for weapon) is an allweather air-to-air missile developed completely by DRDO. Currently, ASTRA is capable engaging targets a distance of 110 km. The ASTRA missiles are integrated with Sukhoi Su-30 MKI aircrafts of India.

7th 2019 Global Terrorism index: India 7th – most affected by terror attacks, Afghan 1st Place

- The Sydney (Australia) based Institute for Economics and Peace (IEP) released the 7th edition of its annual report titled "2019 Global Terrorism Index: Measuring the impact of terrorism". As per the Index India was ranked at the 7th place in the list of countries most affected by terrorism in 2018.
- The country which topped the list was **Afghanistan** with 7,379 killed due to terror attacks in 2018. Afghanistan's Taliban terrorist group has been ranked first as the deadliest terror groups.
- The other countries in the list include Iraq (2nd), Nigeria (3rd), Syria (4th), Pakistan (5th) and Somalia (6th).

Prithvi-2 missile successfully test fired

■ India successfully test-fired two rounds of its indigenously developed nuclear-capable Prithvi-II missile at night as part of a user trial by Indian Army. These test were conducted from a mobile launcher from Launch Complex-3 of Chandipur Integrated Test Range (ITR) in Balasore district of Odisha. These were second night trials of Prithvi-II missile.

About Prithvi-2 missile

■ It is surface-to-surface tactical missile with a strike range of 350 km. It is India's first missile indigenously developed by DRDO under prestigious Integrated Guided Missile Development Program (IGMDP). It is capable of carrying 500 to 1,000 kg of warheads, both conventional as well as nuclear.

Poonch Link up Day celebrated by Indian Army

- Indian Army on November 23, 2019 commemorated the Poonch Link-up Day.
- The event was organized to pay tribute to the soldiers who sacrificed their lived defending Poonch during the conflict in 1948

Highlights

■ The army laid its wreath at the War Memorial in the Poonch District. The event was conducted to mark Operation Easy that was aimed to defend the Poonch district from the invading Pakistan.

Poonch District

■ The Poonch district is bounded by Line of Control on all three sides. In 1947-48 war, the district was divided between India and Pakistan. A part of the district went to Pakistan and the other part became a part of the then Indian state Jammu and Kashmir.

By 2025, ₹ 35,000 crore Indian Army logistics target

- India has set a target of exporting 5 billion dollar (` 35,000 crore) of military equipment by the year 2025.
- Defense Minister Sanjay Rajnath Singh announced that all countries can invest in India's defense sector.
- Rajnath Singh has traveled to Thailand to participate in the Security Forces Secretariat of eight countries, including the Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and India, which is a member of its alliance. He announced in a seminar 'Rise of India' in Thailand's capital, Bangkok.

L&T Valves secures Green Channel Status

- L&T Valves has become the first private enterprise in India to secure the 'Green Channel Status' from the Directorate General Quality Assurance (DGQA), Ministry of Defence, Government of India.
- Additional Director General, Quality Assurance (Warship Projects) formally awarded the 'Green Channel Status' to L&T Valves during the QA Industry Conclave (South Zone) in Chennai.

NIA hosts the first counter terrorism exercise for Quad Countries

- The National Investigation Agency will host the first "Counter Terrorism Exercise" between November 21, 2019 and November 22, 2019.
- The CT-TTX,Counter Terrorism Table Top Exercise will exercise the Quad countries namely India, Japan, US and Australia.

1.3 World Organisations - Pacts and Summits

Basic ministerial meet on climate change

- The 29th ministerial meet of BASIC countries was held at Beijing between October 25-26, 2019.
- The BASIC countries include **Brazil**, **South Africa**, **India and China**.

BASIC countries

- The BASIC countries are the block of Brazil, India, China and South Africa formed based on an agreement in 2009.
- They committed to act jointly at the Copenhagen Climate Summit. The countries announced plans and targets accordingly. The grouping also agreed to provide technical aid to G77 countries.

UNESCO designates Mumbai and Hyderabad as member of UCCN

- UNESCO has designated Mumbai as a member of UNESCO Creative Cities Network (UCCN) in the field of FILM and Hyderabad in the field of GASTRONOMY.
- The 7 categories for recognition under UCCN are Crafts and Folk Arts, Design, Film, Gastronomy, Music, Media Arts and Literature.
- Previously, 3 Indian cities were recognized as members of UCCN, namely- Jaipur-Crafts and Folk Arts (2015), Varanasi-Creative city of Music (2015), Chennai-Creative city of Music (2017).

Kerala Governor inaugurates Avurveda summit

- Kerala Governor Arif Mohammed Khan inaugurated the 3rd edition of Global Ayurveda Summit 2019.
- As many as 400 industry leaders and delegates from SAARC, GCC and African countries have gathered in Kochi for the Global Ayurveda Summit 2019.
- The two-day summit organized by Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) will deliberate on the theme "Mainstreaming Ayurveda through Startups, Innovation and Branding".

35th ASEAN Summit begins in Bangkok



- The 35th ASEAN Summit began in Bangkok, Thailand from October 31 to 4 November.
- The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) is a group of ten member countries that encourages political, economic and social cooperation in the region.
- The theme of the summit for this year is "Advancing Partnership for Sustainability".

COP25 cancelled

- The Chile Government cancelled the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit and the COP25 conference due to the ongoing protests in the country.
- The country's president in a press meet said that the **ongoing violent protests** have plagued the country for weeks and it is currently not in a situation to hold international conferences.
- This is the second time a country is cancelling to host COP25. In November, 2018, **Brazil** withdrew from hosting the COP25 citing economic reasons

COP25

- The Conference of Parties is the supreme body of the UNFCCC-United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.
- The first COP was held in **Berlin**, **Germany** in **1995**.

WHO study on physical activity-India ranks 8th

- The World Health Organization published its study about physical activity of adolescents aged between 11 and 17 years.
- The study was conducted across 146 countries with the help of data from 298 school-based surveys. The assessment included physical education, active play, recreation and sports, walking, planned exercises and cycling.

Highlights: India

- India was ranked eighth reporting lowest level of physical activity. Though, India was one of the top performers around 74% of adolescents showed insufficient physical activity.
- In India the overall insufficient physical activity in 2001 was 76.6% and has now decreased to 73.9% in 2016.

Kanpur is world's most polluted city: Guinness World Records 2020

- The city of **Kanpur in Uttar Pradesh** held the title for the world's most polluted city in the latest edition of Guinness World Records.
- The book, 'Guinness World Records 2020', lists thousands of new record titles and holders that will educate curious readers of all age groups.
- It is released annually by publisher **Penguin Random** House.

Kanpur: The Most Polluted City in the World

■ A report by World Health Organization (WHO) analyzed that the most polluted city in the world is Kanpur in northern India, with an average PM2.5 level of 173 micrograms/m3 for the year 2016.

50th World Economic Forum to be held in Switzerland in January 2020

- The 50th edition of the World Economic Forum (WEF) is to be held in Davos-Klosters, Switzerland, from 21-24 January 2020.
- The theme of the forum is fixed as 'Stakeholders for a Cohesive and Sustainable World'.

World Customs Organization recognised HS Code for India's Signature Fabrics-A Boost for Khadi Exports

■ The Ministry of Commerce and Industry has allocated separate HS code for signature fabric of India. HS stands for Harmonized System and was developed by the World Customs Organization (WCO). The code is used by customs officers to clear commodities entering or crossing international border.

HS Code

■ It is a multipurpose International Nomenclature that describes type of goods being shipped. The code follows **Kyoto**Convention of 1974. It is being used by more than 200 countries.

BRICS summit

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi will embark on a two-day visit to Brazil from November 13 to attend the 11th BRICS summit, the Ministry of External Affairs.
- BRICS bring together five major world economies, namely Brazil, Russia, India, China, and South Africa, which comprise 42 per cent of the world population, contribute to 23 per cent of global Gross Domestic Product and around 17 per cent of the share in world trade.
- The theme of this year's summit is economic growth for an innovative future.

Roar of the sea: Naval Exercise between Qatar and India

- A three-day naval exercise, Za'ir-Al-Bahr (Roar of the Sea) is being conducted between November 17 and November 21, 2019 between the Indian and Oatar Naval Forces.
- The aim of the exercise is to enhance interoperability between the naval forces.


- BRIC is an acronym for the economic bloc of countries consisting of Brazil, Russia, India, and China.

Govt plans to merge Daman and Diu, Dadra and Nagar Haveli Union Territories

- Two Union Territories Daman and Diu, and Dadra and Nagar Haveli will be merged into one and a bill in this effect will be tabled in Parliament next week, Union Minister Arjun Meghwala anounced in the Lok Sabha.

- Amaravati was missing from the map, released by the Survey of India on November 2.



■ Saurabh Chaudhary claimed the silver medal in men's 10m air pistol event to continue India's surge at the 14th







- Sri Lanka has become first South Asian nation to criminalise several offences related to match-fixing.
- The move comes after Sri Lankan parliament passed of a bill related to it labelled as "Prevention of Offences Related to Sports".

Experts discover 3000-year-old city in Pakistan



■ AAI had inducted the first woman fire fighter

in its ranks in 2018, heralding a change. Taniya Sanyal from Kolkata was the first women firefighter to join AAI.

Dr.Vinaya Shetty appointed as IODA's 1st Indian and Asian General Vice President

■ Dr.Vinaya Shetty from Mumbai, Maharashtra was appointed as the first Indian and Asian to be elected as the General Vice President (GVP) of the International Organisation Development Association (IODA).



Key Points:

In 2016, Vinaya became the first Indian woman entrepreneur finalist for the prestigious Empretech Women in Business Award by United National Conference Trade and Development (UNCTAD).

State chief information commisioner

- Tamil Nadu Governor Banwarilal Purohit administered the oath of office to R.Rajagopal. The IAS Officer takes over as the new State Chief Information Commissioner (SCIC).
- He previously held the post of Additional Chief Secretary to the Governor.

NGT Bench to function from December 2

- The Southern bench of the National Green Tribunal is all set to function from December 2, from Kalas Mahal here, nearly two years after the bench fell vacant with all judicial members and expert members retiring.
- The National Green Tribunal's Principal Bench issued a notification that "consequent upon the postings of justice K.Ramakrishnan, Judicial Member and Saibal Dasgupta, Expert Member, the Southern Zone Bench, Chennai will start functioning for regular sittings from December 2, 2019".
- The Southern Bench was moved to the heritage building Kalas Mahal which was spruced up at a cost ₹14.5 crore by the Public Works department.

C.Maniwannan appointed as The President of indian Agricultural Research Scientists Association

- Dr. Mani Wannan has been appointed as the President of the Association of Agricultural Research Scientists of India level.
- The launch of the Indian Agricultural Research Scientists' Association for the Year 2019-2022 was held last October.
- This is the first time a South Indian scientist has been identified as a leader in the 1980s that he is the Chief Scientist at the Indian Institute of Soil and Water Resources, located in Uganda.

Lt Col Sharma appointed as Army's 1st female JAG officer deployed on foreign mission

■ Lieutenant Colonel Jyoti Sharma has been appointed as Indian Army's first female Judge Advocate General officer to be deployed on a foreign mission. She will be appointed as the military legal expert with the Govt of Seychelles. Jyoti's main role would be to update the Govt of Seychelles officials on the defence and military act. The Army is also preparing to induct women in Military Police Corps.

Lieutenant Shivangi: 1st woman pilot of Indian Navy to join Naval operations

■ Lieutenant Shivangi become first woman pilot of Indian Navy will join Naval operations. She will join after naval operations on completion of operational training at the Southern Naval Command in Kochi, Kerala on December 2, 2019 two days ahead of Navy Day (observed on December 4).

Karabi gogoi becomes the 1st woman Navy officer designated as defence attache to Russia

■ Lt-Commander (equivalent to an Army Major), Karabi Gogoi from Guwahati, Assam has become the first woman officer from the Navy to be posted as Assistant Naval Attache at the Indian embassy



at the Indian embassy in Moscow, Russia.

1.13 Latest Historical Events

Revisiting Jallianwala Bagh through Victoria Memorial

■ Victoria Memorial Hall, a symbol of grandeur of the colonial era, will for the first time host an exhibition on what is considered the worst blot on the British Empire, the Jallianwala Bagh massacre of 1919.



- The installation exhibition titled, 'Ways of Remembering Jallianwala Bagh & Rabindranath Tagore's Response to the Massacre' is unique not only because it links Punjab and Bengal almost 100 years after the Killings bur because of the venue hosting it.
- It was only a couple of years after the massacre that Victoria Memorial was opened to the public in 1921 and this is the first time that the hall is holding some event around the killings.



2.1 Latest Court Verdicts

Ayodya Verdict

The verdict:

■ The Hindus would get the entire disputed 2.77 acres in Ayodhya where the demolished Babri Masjid once stood. Possession of disputed 2.77 acre land will remain with Central government receiver. The Muslims will get alternate five acres of land either in the surplus 67 acres acquired in and around the disputed structure by the central government or any other "prominent" place. A trust will be formed in 3 months to build a temple on the disputed land. The court held that the Nirmohi Akhara is not the shebait or devotee of the deity Ram Lalla but will get to be a member of the Trust.

Five Judge Constitution Bench

- The Supreme Court's five-judge constitution bench includes:
 - 1. Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi
 - 2. Justice SA Bobde
 - 3. Justice DY Chandrachud
 - 4. Justice Ashok Bhushan
 - 5. Justice S Abdul Nazeer
 - 6. The bench has reserved its judgement on October 16, 2019 after conducting a marathon hearing of **40 days**.
- 1885: The Ayodhya land dispute dates back to 1885 when the first-ever suit was filed during the British Rule by MahanthRaghubar Das to construct a Ram Temple at Ayodhya.

Article 142, invoked by SC to give land for a mosque

■ The Supreme Court, implicitly referring to the demolition of the Babri Masjid at the disputed site, said that it was invoking Article 142 "to ensure that a wrong committed must be remedied".

Article 142(1) states that

"The Supreme Court in the exercise of its jurisdiction may pass such decree or make such order as is necessary for doing complete justice in any cause or matter pending before it, and any decree so passed or order so made shall be enforceable throughout the territory of India in such manner as may be prescribed by or under any law made by Parliament and, until provision in that behalf is so made, in such manner as the President may by order prescribe".

40-day hearing

■ The hearing in the politically and religiously sensitive decades-old temple-mosque land dispute in Ayodhya was the second longest proceedings in the history of the Supreme Court which had lasted for 40 days.

Result on Saturday

In a historic verdict, the Supreme Court on Saturday backed the construction of a Ram temple by a government trust at the disputed site in Ayodhya, and ruled that an alternative five-acre plot must be found for a mosque in the Hindu holy town.

'Office of Chief Justice of India comes under RTI Act'

■ The Office of the Chief Justice of India (CJI) is a 'public authority' under the **Right to Information (RTI)** Act, a five-judge Constitution Bench led by Chief Justice of India Ranjan Gogoi declared. The main judgment of the Constitution Bench authored by Justice Sanjiv Khanna said the Supreme Court is a 'public authority' and the office of the CJI is part and parcel of the institution. Hence, if the Supreme Court is a public authority, so is the office of the CJI.

Background About RTI

- In 2010, the CIC (Central Information Commission) ordered the SC CPIOs (Central Public Information Officer) to provide information on personal assets possessed by the judges of SC. The order was challenged at the Delhi HC to which it ruled that SC and CJI have statutory duty to furnish information regarding administration and functioning of the SC.
- **Right to Information (RTI)** is act of the **Parliament of India** to provide for setting out the practical regime of the right to information for citizens and replaces the erstwhile **Freedom of information Act, 2002.** Under the provisions of the Act, any citizen of India may request information from a "public authority" (a body of Government or "instrumentality of State") which is required to reply expeditiously or within thirty days.
- The Act also requires every public authority to computerise their records for wide dissemination and to proactively certain categories of information so that the citizens need minimum recourse to request for information formally. This law was passed by Parliament on 15 June 2005 and came fully into force on 12 October 2005.

SC dismisses pleas to review Rafale ruling

- A three-judge Bench of the Supreme Court, led by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Ranjan Gogoi, dismissed petitions seeking a review of the December 14, 2018 judgment upholding the purchase of 36 Rafale fighter aircraft.
- The Supreme Court's judgment upholding the Rafale deal will not bar the CBI from acting on a corruption complaint in the defence purchase, provided the agency gets prior sanction from the competent authority to launch an investigation, Justice K.M. Joseph held in his separate opinion in the Rafale review case.
- The judgment sought to be reviewed would not stand in the way of the first respondent [CBI] from taking action on the complaint in accordance with the law and after obtaining previous approval under Section 17A of the Prevention of Corruption Act,".

Rafale deal controversy

■ The Rafale deal controversy is a political controversy in India related to the purchase of 36 multirole fighter aircraft for a price estimated at €7.8 billion by the Defence Ministry of India from France's Dassault Aviation. The origin of the deal lies in the Indian MRCA competition, a multi-billion dollar contract to supply 126 multi-role combat aircraft to the Indian Air Force (IAF).

2.2 Political parties and Political system in India

Forests In Alagar Hills Does Not Belong To The Deity, Holds SC

- The Supreme Court, set aside the Madras High Court judgment which held that the entire forest area in Alagar Hills belongs to the deity of Arulmigu Kallalagar Thirukoil Alagar Koil.
- The bench comprising **Justice L. Nageswara Rao** and **Justice Hemant Gupta** held that the presumption of lost grant cannot be applied when there is no evidence of continuous possession under an assertion of title.
- Sundara Ramanuja Periya Jeer Swamigal of Periya Jeer Swamigal Mutt, Tirupati and others had filed a suit for a declaration that the entire forest areain Alagar Hills to Sri ArulmighuKallalagar also called Sri Sundarajasami or Sundara Bahu or Paramasamy, the Presiding Deity of the temple.

Maharashtra under President's rule for 3rd time in 59-year history

- Imposition of President's rule in Maharashtra is the first instance in the 59-year-old history of the state when Article 356 has been invoked due to inability of political parties to form a government.
- This is third time that Maharashtra has come under the central rule. The present-day Maharashtra came into existence on May 1, 1960.
- The first of it was in **February 1980** when the Indira Gandhi government dismissed the **Progressive Democratic Front (PDF)** government headed by Sharad Pawar.
- **Article 356** of the Constitution, under which President's rule is imposed in a state, deals with 'failure of constitutional machinery in the state'.

2.3 Govt – Welfare oriented Govt schemes, their utility

Govt announced Bharatiya Poshan Krishi Kosh for better nutritional outcomes in New Delhi

- The union Minister of Women and Child Development (MoWCD) Smt Smriti Zubin Irani has announced the Bharatiya Poshan Krishi Kosh (BPKK), a repository of a variety of crops across 128 agro-climatic zones for better nutritional outcomes in New Delhi, MoWCD has collaborated with Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation for this project.
- Aim: The aim of the kosh is to reduce malnutrition through multi-sectoral results-based framework, which includes agriculture, among women and children across the country. It also aims to promote healthy dietary practices.

OCI can now apply for National Pension System

■ The Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) will now be eligible to apply for National Pension System (NPS) at par with Non Resident Indians (NRIs). The permission to permit OCI to enroll in NPS was given by Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA). The decision is one of the endeavours of PFRDA towards promoting and developing NPS and increasing pension coverage in country.

Key Highlights

As per a notification issued by Finance Ministry, now, any Indian citizen, resident or non-resident and OCIs are eligible to join NPS till age of 65 years.

About National Pension System (NPS)

■ It was initially notified for Central government employees joining service on or after 1 January 2004. The NPS was subsequently adopted by almost all State Governments for its employees and was later extended to all citizens of India (on a voluntary basis) from May 2009, to corporate in December 2011 and to Non-Resident Indians (NRI) in October 2015.

Centre notifies RTI rules for CIC, ICs; tenure cut to 3 years

- The tenure of central and state information commissioners has now been reduced from five to three years.
- The notified rules are 'The Right to Information (Term of Office, Salaries, Allowances and Other Terms and Conditions Service of Chief of Information Commissioner, Information Commissioners the Central in Information Commission, State Chief Information Commissioner and State Information Commissioners in the State Information Commission) Rules, 2019'.
- The tenure of chief and information commissioners in the Central Information Commission (CIC) and State Central Information Commissions (SCICs) have been reduced to three years, instead of the five years.
- The rules prescribe a fixed quantum of salary for commissioners- Chief of CIC at ₹2.50 lakh per month, Chief of SICs and information commissioners of CIC and SICs at ₹2.25 lakh per month.

T.N. a major beneficiary of PM's crop insurance scheme

■ Though Tamil Nadu was late in joining the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY-Prime Minister's Crop Insurance Scheme), the State has emerged as one of the major beneficiaries of the programme, with its farmers having been sanctioned around `7,000 crore cumulatively in the last two-and-a-half years. The scheme was launched in early 2016. The insurance scheme came in handy for those farmers during the rabi season (or sambal). The payouts began in July 2017. Till now, nearly `3,500 crore has been credited to the farmers' bank accounts. Tamil Nadu came first in terms of compensation received for the season that year.

Disabled People over 80 can vote through Postal Ballot

- The people over 80 years of age and Persons with Disability can now cast their votes through postal ballot.
- However, such voters will have both the choices available either voting through postal ballot by following due procedure or going to the polling station on polling day for voting.
- On the recommendations of the Election Commission, the Ministry of Law and Justice has amended the Conduct of Election Rules, 1961, allowing senior citizens and person with disabilities in the absentee voter list.
- The person will make an application in a new Form 12 D, which will reach the Returning Officer within 5 days following the date of notification of election.

Bhavantar Bharpayee Yojna Scheme: Haryana includes more crops

■ The state government Haryana has decided to bring more crops under its 'Bhavantar Bharpayee Yojna (BBY)' scheme. The decision was taken at a BBY's review meeting which was presided by Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar.

About Bhavantar Bharpayee Yojna (BBY) scheme

■ BBY is a scheme for vegetable growers. Under it farmers get compensated for selling their crop at a price lower than that fixed by government. The scheme launched in January 2018 then included potato, onion, tomato and cauliflower. It has been very successful in past two years it.

Committee to draft new National Water Policy

- The Union Water Resources Ministry has finalised a committee to draft a new National Water Policy (NWP). It will be chaired by Mihir Shah, who is a former Planning Commission member and a water expert.
- The committee has 10 principal members, including Shashi Shekhar, a former secretary of Water Resources, and A.B. Pandya, former chairman of the Central Ground Water Board. The NWP currently in force was drafted in 2012 and is the third such policy since 1987.
- Among the major policy innovations in the 2012 policy was the concept of an Integrated Water Resources Management approach that took the "river basin/ sub-basin" as a unit for planning, development and management of water resources.

India mulls 'One Nation, One Pay Day': Labour Minister Santosh Gangwar

To safeguard the interest of workers in formal sector, particularly working class, the Centre is planning to introduce 'One Nation, One Pay Day' system, announced by the Labour Minister Santosh Gangwar.



■ There should be a pan-India single wage day every month across various sectors to ensure that workers get timely payment of salaries.

Health Ministry launches 'SAANS' campaign

- Union Ministry for Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) launched SAANS: 'Social Awareness and Action to Neutralise Pneumonia Successfully' campaign to reduce child mortality due to pneumonia.
- Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan launched the campaign while inaugurating the 6th National Summit on Good, Replicable Practices and Innovations.

About SAANS campaign

Objective:

■ To reduce child mortality due to pneumonia. To mobilise people to protect children from pneumonia. To train health personnel and other stakeholders to provide prioritized treatment to control the disease.

SARAS inaugurated at IITF 2019 in New Delhi

- Union Rural Development Ministry inaugurated the SARAS India International Trade Fair at Pragati Maidan in Delhi.
- SARAS Mela aims to bring the rural women SHG members formed under DAY-NRLM, in one platform to showcase their skills, sell and build linkages with potential market players.
- More than seven crore women have joined Self-Help Groups so far and the Ministry is making all efforts to take this number to 10 crore.

'Maternity scheme reaches only onethird of beneficiaries'

- A vital programme to support lactating mothers and pregnant women by compensating them for loss of wages during their pregnancy has been able to reach less than a third of the eligible beneficiaries, researchers who extrapolated from data obtained under the Right to Information (RTI).
- Almost 61% of beneficiaries registered under the Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) between April 2018 and July 2019 (38.3 lakh out of the total 62.8 lakh out of the total 62.8 lakh enrolled) received the full amount of ₹6,000 promised under the scheme, according to an RTI reply.
- The PMMVY is targeted only at women delivering their first child. A cash amount of `6,000 is transferred to the bank account of the beneficiary in three instalments upon meeting certain conditions including early registration of pregnancy, having at least one ante-natal c heck-up and registration of child birth.

Niti Aayog's report to reveal India's health system

Niti Aayog will soon come up with a report on health system for India, highlighting the challenges impacting the sector. The report titled New India: Building Blocks - Potential Pathways to Reforms is a synthesis of all the discussions and efforts initiated at the national-level workshop held last year. NITI Aayog vice chairman Rajiv Kumar will release the report in the presence of Bill Gates, co-chairman of Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, and representatives from national and international academia.

■ Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEF&CC) is undertaking a mass cleanliness-cumawareness drive in 50 identified beaches under the programme called 'Swachh-Nirmal Tat Abhiyaan', from 11 -17 November 2019.

About Swachh- Nirmal Tat Abhiyaan

■ **Objective:** To strive to make coastal areas across country clean, and to create awareness amongst citizens about the importance of coastal ecosystems so as to save marine creatures from plastic waste, industrial effluents and other harmful substances.

11,000 scientists in 153 countries declare climate emergency

- In a paper published in the journal Bio-Science, 11,258 signatories (69 from India) declared Global Climate Emergency. They presented climate change trends and methods to mitigate the threat. The report was titled "World Scientists"
- It is based on the scientific analysis of more than 40 years of publicly available data.
- It illustrates several key climate change indicators since the scientists from 50 nations met at the First World Climate Conference in Geneva in 1979.

Bengal's cities yield new species of tree frog

It took six herpetologists working across States and countries to determine that a tree frog found



- commonly in urban habitats of West Bengal was a brand new species.
- The new species has been named Brown Blotched Bengal Tree Frog (Polypedates bengalensis).

India's first elephant memorial in Mathura unveiled

Wildlife SOS, Indiabased conservation charity, unveiled India's first elephant memorial in Mathura, Uttar Pradesh. The memorial is a



unique way to honour elephants that lost their lives to illegal trafficking, abuse, and cruelty. The memorial will be a constant reminder that elephants belong in the wild, and they must be protected and conserved there. No wild animal deserves a life of brutality, such as that suffered by captive elephants in India.

Wildlife SOS:

- Established in: 1995
- Founder: Kartick Satyanarayan and Geeta Seshamani The main objective of Wildlife SOS is to protect and preserve India's wildlife. The non-profit organization runs rehabilitation and rescue centres for wildlife, conserve habitats for the animals.

Climate change is harming health of children, says Lancet report

■ Climate change is already damaging the health of the world's children and is set to endanger the well-being of an entire generation, unless the world meets the target to limit warming to well below 2°C, according to a major new report published in The Lancet. The project is collaboration between 120 experts from 35 institutions, including the World Health Organisation, the World Bank, University College London, and the Tsinghua University in Beijing.

India's first Signal Fish "Pteropsaron indicum" found in Kerala



The new signal fish was found in Lakshadweep Sea off Kerala coast which is the home for unusual species like fish with a unique color. The name of the species is "Pterdopsaron indicum", was collected by trawlers at a depth of 70 meters during a marine biodiversity survey. Scientists from the University of Kerala and the Ocean Science Foundation, United State of America (USA) have described the discovery of the new species of signal fish, was the first one of the genus recorded in Indian waters.

West Bengal celebrates 'Rosogolla Dibas' to mark GI Tag granting

■ West Bengal celebrated the 'Rosogolla Dibas' or Rasgulla Day on 14 November 2019 to mark the granting of Geographical Indication (GI) tag of 'BanglarRosogolla' or Bengal's Rasgulla to the state on this day two years ago (14 November 2017).

Rosogolla Dibas celebrations

- The statue of **Nobin Chandra Das**, inventor of the Bengal variant of the sweetmeat, was garlanded across the state.
- For the first time in the history of West Bengal's sweetmeat industry, almost all sweet shops in state are dedicated this day to Rosogolla.

Dal Lake, J&K to be declared Eco-Sensitive Zone

■ The Jammu and Kashmir Government will set up a 10-member committee that will declare Dal Lake, an Eco-sensitive Zone. The decision is being taken based on the study conducted by the DCI-Dredging Corporation of IndiaThe capacity of the lake has shrunk to 40%

Eco-Sensitive Zones

■ The ESZs are called Ecologically Fragile Areas. A region or territory is notified as ESZ by the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate change. In General, the regions are around wild life sanctuaries, protected areas and National Parks.

CSIR's-NGRI, Hyderabad releases 1st ever Geochemical Baseline Atlas of India'

In a bid to understand and asses the environmental damage and held policy makers to devise a strategy, CSIR-NGRI (Council of Scientific & Industrial Research Institute), based in Hyderabad, Telangana, has released the 1st ever, 'Geochemical Baseline Atlas of India'.

Key Points:

■ The Atlas, consists of 44 maps of metals, oxides, and elements present in top and bottom soils across India, will help to document the concentration and distribution of the chemical elements in the soils of India.

Darjeeling Green Tea & White Tea receive GI Tag



■ Two tea varieties of Darjeeling were registered under "Geographical Indication of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999". It includes Green Tea and White Tea of Darjeeling.

Darjeeling Tea

 Darjeeling produces 85 lakh kilograms of tea. Of this Green Tea constitutes 10 lakh kilo grams and White Tea constitutes 1 lakh kilo grams.

GI Tag

■ The Geographical Indication is used on products that correspond to a specific geographical location.

The Sumatran rhino is now extinct in Malaysia

- The last known Sumatran rhinoceros in Malaysia died after a battle with cancer, leaving the species officially extinct in the country.
- There are now only an estimated 80 Sumatran rhinos left in the world, with the species labeled as "critically endangered," according to the World Wildlife Fund (WWF).
- The rhino named Iman died of natural causes due to shock in her system, the Wildlife Department in eastern Sabah state on Borneo Island.

Avian Botulism-Reason behind birds' death in Sambhar Lake

- The Indian Veterinary Research Institute (IVRI) confirmed that a neuro muscular illness called Avian Botulism is the reason for mass mortality of migratory birds in Sambhar Lake in Rajasthan.
- The doctors say that the birds were suffering from Avian Botulism that was caused due to a toxin produced by bacterial strain.
- Thousands of migratory birds died in Sambhar lake that sent shock waves throughout the country.

3.2 Natural Disasters – Safeguard Measures

Mumbai, Kolkata may get flooded by 2050, says new research

- A new research done by a US-based agency claims that more than three and a half crore people in **India** as against the 50 lakh estimated earlier could actually be affected by annual coastal flooding by 2050 and that large parts of **Mumbai**, **Navi Mumbai** and **Kolkata** could be inundated if global **CO**₂ emissions are not cut drastically.
- According to the Climate Central study published in journal, Nature Communications, coastal flood risks assessments based on NASA's Shuttle Radar Topography Mission (SRTM) have under-estimated the elevation risks.
- The new research method CoastalDEM reduced these errors by using artificial intelligence tools and came up with the new estimates.
- The study states that coastal flooding could impact 300 million people globally by 2050 and the high tide lines could permanently rise above land occupied by some 150 million people, mostly in Asia.

Around 1000 migratory birds dead at Sambhar lake

- Thousands of migratory birds of about ten species were found dead around Sambhar Lake, the country's largest inland saltwater lake near Jaipur, sending shock waves among locals and authorities.
- This is the second such incident in the state within a week. Recently, 37 demoiselle cranes were found dead in Jodhpur's Khinchan area.
- Decomposition of plants, algae, and animals creates anaerobic environments that facilitate growth of **C. botulinum**, which may then enter into food webs leading to intoxication of animals.

Cyclone Kyarr to become 1st Super Cyclone in Arabian Sea in 12 years

- Cyclone 'Kyarr' intensifies to become the first Super Cyclonic storm in Arabian Sea in last 12 years after Cyclone Gonu ravaged the Oman coast in 2007.
- According to the IMD forecast, Cyclone Kyarr is likely to continue its movement westnorthwest wards Oman coast.
- Heavy Rainfall to very heavy rainfall very likely in Kerala & Mahe.



4.1 New Economic Policy & Govt. Sector

Power Ministry recommends Maharatna status to Power

- The power ministry has recommended 'maharatna' status for Power Grid Corp of India Ltd (PGCIL), the country's largest power transmission company.
- 'Maharatna' status allows state-run firms greater financial autonomy, they can decide on investments of up to 15% of their net worth in a project without government approval.
- PowerGrid is the third largest Central Public Sector Enterprise in India as well as one of the largest transmission company globally.
- It has been recognised as 'Fastest Growing Electric Utility in Asia Pacific' successively for the last six years, since 2014

India among top nations with most conducive environment for financial inclusion

According to The Economist Intelligence Unit's 2019 Global Microscope on Financial Inclusion report, the overall environment for financial inclusion has improved globally with India, Colombia, Peru, Uruguay and Mexico having the most favorable conditions for inclusive finance.

India to contribute \$13.5 mn for UN development activities for 2020

India will contribute USD 13.5 million for various operational activities of development across the UN agencies for the year 2020. The contribution was announced at the UN General Assembly Pledging Conference for Development Activities.

What is 'Project Zero' introduced by Amazon in India?

■ To block selling of counterfeit goods on its platform, e-commerce giant Amazon has introduced 'Project Zero' in India, in a bid to ensure that customers receive authentic goods when shopping on Amazon.

What is 'Project Zero'?

■ It introduces additional proactive mechanisms and powerful tools to identify, block and remove counterfeits. More7,000 brands have already enrolled in Project Zero across United States, Europe and Japan. A number of Indian brands participated in a pilot to help Amazon test the experience in India.

PM Modi to visit Saudi for Future Investment Initiative

- The Prime Minister Modi is to attend the third session of Future Investment Initiative Forum in Saudi Arabia. The PM will deliver a keynote address at the forum.
- He will also meet the Saudi king Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud. He will hold delegation level talks with Crown Prince Mohammad bin Salman

Future Investment Initiative (FII)

- FII is an annual investment forum organized by the Public Investment Fund of Saudi Arabia.
- It was begun in 2017. The first event announced the launch of **NEOM**, a 500 billion USD economic zone in north west of Saudi Arabia.

Karnataka Gramin Bank initiates 'mobile ATMs' in rural areas

- The Karnataka Gramin Bank (KGB) has launched 'mobile ATMs' in Kalaburagi, among several other districts in the Karnataka. The special vehicle includes an ATM and a screen to show videos of different banking schemes.
- The mobile ATMs will go to the doorsteps of the farmers and make them aware of the banking schemes and digital operating systems.
- A bank official would be present in the van, who will provide information regarding the digital operating systems and schemes.

Arcelor Mittal's takeover of Essar cleared by SC

- The Supreme Court accepted Arcelor Mittal's offer to pay an aggregate ₹42,000 crore as an upfront amount to the secured financial creditors of bankrupt Essar Steel.
- This paves the way for Arcelor Mittal to take over Essar and enter the world's second biggest steel market.
- SC uses extraordinary powers under Article 142 to give Arcelor Mittal a chance to pay off the NPAs of corporate debtors as a pre-condition to buy Essar Steel.

After 2 years' battle, Arcelor Mittal enters India

- Steel baron Lakshmi Niwas Mittal led Arcelor Mittal is set to enter India this month or early next month, after a prolonged legal tussle in various courts for over two years in the Essar Steel case under the IBC.
- Essar Steel will bring the largest recovery among the dozen firms, flagged by RBI for the resolution process, as banks will recover ₹42,000 crore against admitted debts of ₹49,473 crore a recovery of about 85% compared to the average recovery of 53% in other resolution cases.



Government to open up national procurement portal to private companies for bulk buying

- The government plans to open up the national online procurement portal **Government e-Marketplace (GeM)** to government contractors and private entities but only for bulk buying.
- The National Public Procurement Portal is Section 8 Company registered under the Companies Act, 2013, for providing procurement of goods & services required by Central & State Government organizations.

GeM

■ The commerce and industry ministry launched the **GeM on August 9, 2016** in place of Directorate General of Supplies and Disposal (DGS&D) with the objective of creating an open and transparent procurement platform of commonly used goods and services for all government departments, ministries and agencies.

Gold is thrid-most popular investment

■ "Gold is the third-most consistently bought investment — 46% of global retail investors have chosen gold products, behind savings accounts (78%) and life insurance (54%)," stated the Retail Gold Insights 2019 report by the World Gold Council.

World Gold Council

- The **World Gold Council** is the market development organisation for the gold industry.
- It works across all parts of the industry, from gold mining to investment, and their aim is to stimulate and sustain demand for gold.

Moody's revises India's economic outlook to "negative" from "Stable"

- The American financial service company Moody's has downgraded India's economic outlook "Negative" from "Stable". This downgrade was due to slow growth in the economy. It also predicted that slow growth would be prolonged and would also have debt rises. Moody's has also predicted a budget deficit of 3.7% of the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in the year through March 2020, which is a breach in the govt's target of 3.3%.
- This was due to corporate tax rate cuts, slow growth etc. The long term foreign currency bond and bank deposit ceilings were unchanged at Baa1 and Baa2 (both being 2nd lowest investment-grade score), respectively.

World economy weakens next year due to trade war and political changes: Moody's Report

- The global economic situation is likely to weaken by 2020 as a result of international trade war and political changes, according to the economic research firm Moody's. The world economy suffered its worst crisis in 2008-2009. The current economic recession was predicted to lead to such a major crisis.
- In spite of the huge economic downturn in 2009, 2020 is unlikely to be the case. Moody>s has announced the situation will continue next year.

4.2 Current Socio-Economic Problems

WPI inflation eases to 0.16%

- Wholesale prices based inflation eased further to 0.16 per cent in October, as against 0.33 per cent in September due to subdued prices of non-food articles and fall in prices of manufactured items.
- The annual inflation, based on monthly wholesale price index (WPI), was at 5.54 per cent in October 2018.
- For manufactured products, the wholesale inflation was at (-)0.84 per cent in October 2019.
- However, the retail inflation for the month hit a 16-month high of 4.62 per cent due to soaring prices of food articles, including fruits and vegetables.

Moody's cuts India's GDP growth forecast to 5.6 per cent for 2019

- Moody's Investors Service slashed India's economic growth forecast to 5.6 per cent for 2019, saying government measures do not address the widespread weakness in consumption demand.
- Moody's had slashed India's economic growth forecast for 2019-20 fiscal to 5.8 per cent from an earlier estimate of 6.2 per cent.

\$5-trillion GDP needs 12.4% nominal growth a year, says NITI Aayog

- Gross domestic product (GDP) in India at current prices needs to grow by 12.4 per cent annually over the next five years for the country to be a \$5-trillion economy by 2024-25, an internal assessment by the NITI Aayog has showed.
- This is 0.4 percentage points higher than what was estimated by the Economic Survey for 2018-19, owing to a slowing economy and an expected increase in the depreciation of the rupee against the dollar

State of the States 2019

- The India Today Group is back with its annual State of the States survey, which ranks the India's states on a range of parameters adjudicating for the 'best performing' and 'most improved' states across the country.
- **Gujarat** aced all states in the economy category while Punjab led in agriculture and infrastructure.
- Himachal Pradesh with the honours for education and healthcare, Rajasthan for governance, Andhra Pradesh for inclusive development, Haryana for entrepreneurship.

5. SCIENCE

5.1 Latest Inventions on Science & Technology

NASA to Send VIPER Robot to Moon in Search of 'Hundreds of Millions of Tons of Water Ice'

- NASA will send a golf cart-sized robot to the moon in 2022 to search for deposits of water below the surface, an effort to evaluate the vital resource ahead of a planned human return to the moon in 2024 to possibly use it for astronauts to drink and to make rocket fuel.
- The VIPER robot will drive for miles (km) on the dusty lunar surface to get a closer look like underground



pockets of "hundreds of millions of tons of water ice" that could help turn the moon into a jumping-off point to Mars.

'Indian brain is smaller': IIIT-Hyderabad researchers create Indian Brain Atlas

- The average Indian brain is smaller in height, width, and volume as compared to the western and eastern population like the Chinese and Korean according to the first-ever 'Indian Brain Atlas' created by researchers of the International Institute of Information Technology-Hyderabad (IIITH).
- These differences are found even at the structure level like the volume of hippocampus and so on. But overall, the 'IBA 100 is more' comparable to the Chinese and Korean atlases than the distant Caucasian one.

NASA unveils its first electric plane

■ The United States space agency National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) unveiled an early version of its first all-electric experimental aircraft, named as X-57 "Maxwell" at its aeronautics lab in the California desert, US.

About X-57 "Maxwell"

- It was under development since 2015 and remains at least a year away from its first test flight in skies. NASA targets to fly this airplane in late 2020.
- It will be the NASA's first crewed X-plane to be developed in two decades. It is adapted from Italian-made Tecnam P2006T twin-engine propeller plane.

Anaemia among men in India: 23.2% of men has Anaemia

- A report titled 'Anaemia among men in India: A nationally representative cross sectional study' was published in the journal Lancet Global Health. The report was on anaemia in India men. The report mainly aimed to determining the prevalence of anaemia among men in India has found that 23.2 per cent of men had anaemia, ranging from mild to moderate to severe degrees.
- Anaemia prevalence: The State level prevalence of anaemia ranges from 9.2% (average of 7.7%-10.9%) in Manipur to 32.9% (average of 31%-34.7%) in Bihar.

China Successfully Tests Mars Lander in Giant Drop Test

China's Mars lander just successfully completed its first public test: a spectacular drop from 230 feet onto a m o u n t a i n o u s landscape north of Beijing.



- NASA has been working hard on completing its **Mars 2020 rover**, which will hopefully collect rock samples and bring them back to Earth in **2021**.
- The test is yet another sign that China is a force to be reckoned with when it comes to space exploration.

MIT researchers develop new technology to remove CO, from air



- Researchers from Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), United States (US) have developed a new technology to capture carbon dioxide (CO₂) from a stream of air, virtually at any concentration level.
- This is a new advance that may pave the way for new strategies to reduce atmospheric greenhouse gas (GHG) levels.
- The study by researchers was published in the journal Energy and Environmental Science.

About the New Technology

■ While in most of the prevalent methods, removing carbon dioxide (CO₂) from a stream of gas required higher concentrations like those found in flue emissions from fossil fuel-based power plants, but the new method could take out gas even when it was present in very low concentrations.

Chandrayaan-2 orbiter detects Argon-40 on lunar exosphere: ISRO

- Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced that a specialized payload aboard the Chandrayaan-2 orbiter has detected Argon-40 in the gaseous envelope around the Moon.
- The payload named **Chandra's Atmospheric Composition Explorer-2 (CHACE-2)** has made the discovery from an altitude of around 100 km from the lunar surface.
- CHACE-2 is a spectrometer capable of scanning the thin gaseous envelope around the Moon called the lunar exosphere with a very high mass resolution.
- The primary objective of this instrument is to analyze the composition and distribution of Moon's exosphere.


Argon- 40

- Argon-40 is one of the forms of the noble gas Argon and is an important constituent of lunar exosphere.
- The presence of Argon is well established, and even the rock samples from **NASA's Apollo missions** also contained traces of Argon.
- The radioactive decay of rocks deep below the lunar surface release Argon-40 which escapes to the lunar exosphere through seepages and faults.

5G networks on introduced November 1

- Chinese carriers launched 5G services in the world's largest market on November 1, but the coverage remains limited only to major Chinese cities and key areas in lower-tier cities for the initial rollout.
- The launch of 5G by Chinese carriers is a step slow in comparison to local smartphone brands such as **Huawei and Xiaomi**, as they have already introduced several phone models over the past few months that can support 5G networks.

- It caters to all poor patients of uro-oncological cancers like bladder cancer, kidney failure, kidney cancers from different parts of the country.



■ With the new Robotic surgery facility, it becomes the first Government hospital in India to begin the minimally invasive surgery facility.

Safdarjung Government Hospital

■ The LIVE 3-D Laproscopic Surgeries Web cast that shows complex uro-oncology and reconstructive surgeries is first in its kind.

Air India paints 'Ek Onkar' symbol on its Boeing 787 Dreamliner aircraft's

- National Carrier Air India has painted 'Ek Onkar' symbol **Boeing** 787 its Dreamliner aircraft's tail to mark the 550th birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev.
- The aircraft will fly on October 31 from Amritsar to London. The international flight will facilitate Sikh pilgrims visiting Punjab on the occasion of the Birth Anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev.

IIT Delhi to set up space technology cell in collaboration with ISRO

- The Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi (IIT-D) will set up a space technology cell (STC) in collaboration with the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO).
- This collaboration is to contribute to the space technology research areas such as AI (Artificial Intelligence), nanotechnology, functional textiles, smart manufacturing at its campus.
- It is also proposed that IIT, Delhi as an Institute becomes an academic partner of ISRO.

IFFCO introduced India's 1st nanotechnologybased products for on-field trials in Gujarat

■ The world's largest fertilizer cooperative-Indian Farmers Fertiliser Cooperative Limited (IFFCO) introduced India's 1st nanotechnology-based environment-friendly plant nutrition products by introducing nano-nitrogen, nano-zinc and nano-Copper for on-field trials at an event at Fujarat's Kalol unit of IFFCO.

China launches Sudan's first ever satellite "SRSS-1"

■ Sudan's firstever satellite for c o n d u c t i n g research in m i l i t a r y , economic and space technology has been l a u n c h e d



by China. Sudan's remote-sensing satellite (SRSS-1), was developed by the Shenzhen Aerospace Oriental Red Sea Satellite Co.

- The satellite was launched aboard China's Long March-4B rocket along with other Chinese satellites including Gaofen 7, Xiaoxiang-1 08, Whampoa 1 from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Center in northern China.
- The Sudanese satellite has been mainly designed for civil and military remote sensing over Sudan.

Cosmic Yeti

- Scientists have accidentally discovered 'the footprints a monstrous galaxy' being called as 'Cosmic Yeti' in early universe that has never been seen before.
- The discovery provides new insights into the first growing steps of some of biggest galaxies in universe.
- The astronomical findings were published in **Astrophysical Journal**.

IIT Madras developed India's first indigenously made standing wheelchair

Researchers from the Indian institute of Technology-Madras (IITM) has developed India's first indigenously developed standing wheelchair named "Arise".

Key Points:

■ Cost and collaboration: The wheelchair is priced at Rs.15,000 and was developed in collaboration with Phoneix Medical Systems, with the support of the UK-based Wellcome Trust.

IIT Guwahati: Paper based sensors for faster assessment of milk freshness

■ The IIT-G has developed paper-based sensor to make assessment of freshness of milk by simple and instantaneous method. The method can be used to check the quality of milk at the point of milk collection ans also in home kitchens.

China approves world's 1st carbohydrate - based drug GV-971 to cure Alzheimer's disease


■ China's National Medical Products
Administration has officially approved
an indigenously developed Alzheimer's
drug called GV-971 (sodium oligomannurarate). The Shanghai Institute
of Materia Medica (SIMM) under the
Chinese Academy of Sciences has
developed the drug after 22 years of
research jointly with Ocean University of
China and Green Valley Pharmaceutical
Co Ltd.

Alzheimer's disease:

It is an irreversible, progressive brain disorder that slowly destroys, thinking ability, and the capability to carry out simple tasks.

Voyager 2: NASA's Solar System Explorer reaches interstellar space

- NASA's Voyager 2 has exited heliosphere and has entered interstellar space.
- It is now at 11 billion miles from the earth. Information from the spacecraft takes 16.5 hours to reach earth at the speed of light. (Light from the sun takes 8 minutes to reach earth)
- The spacecraft joined its twin voyager 1 on December 10, 2018. The Voyagers were launched to study the outer solar system up close. Voyager 2 will target Saturn, Jupiter, Neptune and Uranus.



Voyager 2

- Voyager 2 is the first spacecraft to study all four planets together. It includes Jupiter,
 Neptune, Saturn and Uranus
- It is the first spacecraft that discovered 14th moon of Jupiter.
- It is the first human-made object to fly by Neptune
- Voyager 2 also discovered 5 moons of Neptune. It identified a "Great Dark Spot" at Neptune. Also the spacecraft discovered that there are four rings around Neptune.

Marengo Sachintendulkar: Newly discovered spider species named after cricketer

 Dhruv Prajapati, a junior researcher pursuing a PhD in spider taxonomy with Gujarat Ecological Education & Research (GEER) Foundation, recently discovered two new species of



spiders. He has named one of the species as Marengo Sachin Tendulkar after Indian crickterSachin Tendulkar and other as IndomarengoChavarapatera which is inspired by Saint Kuriakose Elias Chavara who was a campaigned towards creating awareness about education in Kerala.

■ The findings of his study have been published in September issue of 'Arthropoda Selecta', a Russian journal. His discovery of two flat-bodied spiders has been included in World Spider Catalogue.

NASA renames Ultima thule to Arrokoth after Nazi controversy

- National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) has renamed a distant space rock Ultima Thule, to Arrokoth.
- It is the farthest cosmic body ever visited by a spacecraft, **Arrokoth or** "sky" is a name of the Native American Powhatan language following a significant backlash over the old name's Nazi connotations.
- The name portrait the cooperation with Powhatan Tribal elders.

Japan's Hayabusa 2 is returning to Earth with asteroid samples

- Over the past year-and-a-half, JAXA's Hayabusa 2 spacecraft served as asteroid Ryugu's companion in the vast emptiness of space. It got close enough to fire bullets into its surface and even detonated bombs to disturb the ground and scoop up samples it can take back home. Ryugu is a carbonaceous near-Earth asteroid, and scientists are hoping that the samples it provided can give them more information on the origin and evolution of the inner planets.
- More importantly, they're hoping the samples can help shed light on the origin of water and organic compounds. When Hayabusa 2 gets near enough our planet in December 2020, it will drop the samples in sealed containers. They're expected to re-enter the atmosphere and land in Australia, while the spacecraft heads to new asteroid targets.

Hayabusa2

■ Hayabusa 2 is an asteroid sample-return mission operated by the Japanese space agency, JAXA. It follows on from the Hayabusa mission which returned asteroid samples in 2010. Hayabusa2 was launched on 3 December 2014 and rendezvoused with near-Earth asteroid 162173 Ryugu on 27 June 2018. Hayabusa 2 carries multiple science payloads for remote sensing, sampling, and four small rovers that are investigating the asteroid surface to inform the environmental and geological context of the samples collected.

An ambient air purifier for the outdoors

- Called the 'Cyclofine', it has been developed by IIT M's Department of Civil Engineering and EnviTran, a student start-up at the IIT-M Research Park, and removes 60% of PM10 (particulate matter).
- 'The machine sucks in ambient air at a rate of 750 cubic metre per hour, filters it and sends out cleaner air.
- With additional filtration, it removes 80% of PM2.5 (particulate matter of 2.5 microns and less) and 100% of PM10 from the air we breathe.
- It has a four-stage filtering system and also has an air quality monitoring sensor, which provides real-time air quality index.

The world's first all-electric racing aircraft

■ An Airbus-backed air racing tournament unveiled an electric-powered sports aircraft, billed as the world's first, as the European plane maker seeks to boost its green aerospace technology. The aircraft will use an electric motor that will carry it at flight speeds of around 482 kilometers (300 miles) per hour on a tight 5 kilometer (about 3 miles) circuit, just 10 meters above the ground. Air Race Electric announced the aircraft, called White Lightning and unveiled at the Dubai Air Show will be manufactured by UK-based Condor Aviation.



Chandrayaan 3: India's 2nd attempt to land on Moon by November 2020

- The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) announced their intention to send a second mission to soft-land on the Moon planned for November 2020 dubbed as Chandrayaan 3 mission.
- The Indian Space Agency's first and recent attempt went awry and resulted in a partial failure of Chandrayaan 2 mission after communication was lost with mission's lander (Vikram) and rover (Pragyan) which crash-landed on Moon while attempting a soft-landing.
- However, the Chandrayaan 2 mission is still survived by the Orbiter which has captured highest resolution visuals ever taken of Moon by its High-Resolution Camera (OHRC) from an altitude of ~100 km.

About Chandrayaan 3 Mission

- Chandrayaan 3 will not feature an orbiter of its own: For the new mission, engineers and scientists at Indian space agency will only design and build an entirely new lander and rover.
- Since Chandrayaan 2 mission already has a functional orbiter that is currently in orbit around Moon, Chandrayaan 3 will not feature an orbiter of its own. However, no final decision has been taken by ISRO on the number of payloads on the lander.

Additional 'Detachable Module':

■ The lander and rover will be accompanied by an additional 'detachable module' that packs engine and fuel needed for journey and this module will tentatively be called 'Propulsion Module'.

New diagnostic tool for detecting tuberculosis

■ The World H e a l t h Organisation has aimed at eliminating TB



by 2035, and the Indian government has vouched to do this by 2025.

Battery-operated device

■ Named SeeTB, the device is battery operated and allows quick identification of the bacteria. The team has also developed a clearing ragent called CLR which helps in thinning the collected sputum thus enhancing the bacteria detection.

Sishu Suraksha APP

- The Assam State Commission for Protection of Child Rights is going to launch a mobile app Sishu Suraksha on the occasion of Children's Day.
- The purpose of the app is to empower citizens to take moral responsibility for protecting future generations.
- The app can be used by anyone in the state to lodge a complaint which will be directly registered at Commission.

ISRO to Launch 13 satellites and Cartosat-3

■ The Indian Space Research Organization will launch 13 commercial nano satellites of the United States along with the imaging and mapping satellite Cartostat-3. The launch is scheduled on November 25, 2019.

Highlights

■ The satellites will be launched by PSLV-C47, a Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle into Sun Synchronous Orbit from Satish Dhawan Space Centre at Sriharikota.

CartoSAT-3

Cartosat-3 is the third generation Earth observation satellite built by ISRO. It is one of the most advanced imaging satellites built by the organization so far. It has the capability to produce high resolution aerial images in the world.

Robot CYBIRA launched to aid cops in Visakhapatnam to take complaints

■ Visakhapatnam Police have launched first of its kind cybersecurity interactive robotic agent robot, CYBIRA stationed at Maharanipeta Police Station, which can automatically take complaints an effective manner. A start-up company Robo Coupler Private



Limited has designed a robot 'CYBIRA' (cyber security interactive robotic agent) for registering and disposing of complaints at the police station in an effective manner.

5.2 Latest Discoveries in Health Science

As Delhi pollution levels soar, customers throng an 'oxygen bar' for a breath of fresh air

■ 26-year-old entrepreneur Aryavir Kumar launched a new venture in South Delhi's upscale Select City Walk mall in May. The way he saw it, his Oxy Pure "oxygen bar" would offer bursts of fragrant, purified oxygen to clients seeking relief from jet lag, sleep disorders, hangovers and even depression.

Telangana gets its first 'childfriendly' police station at Hyderabad's Medipally

■ Telangana's first 'child-friendly' police station was inaugurated at the Rachakonda Medipally station by D Ishan, a 7-year-old boy who had wished to become the Police Commissioner for a day. The initiative was conducted by Bachpan Bachao Andolan (BBA), in collaboration with the Rachakonda Police Commissionerate with the aim to ensure a child-friendly environment where all children are freed from mistreatment, abuse and exploitation.

5.3 Mass Media & Communication

'Whistle Reporter' Mobile App for Deepwater Well Complaints

- The government has ordered the conversion of deep-water wells into rainwater harvesting facilities within 24 hours. Meanwhile, the A1 division has developed a processor called Whistle Reporter to detect such wells.
- The ruling party AIADMK has privately developed the Telephone Whistle Reporter Exchange, a privately owned company to find unsealed wells.
- We have to go near the deep wells that are not in use and press a button on this processor.
- At that time, information about the deep well would go directly to the technical side of the AIADMK.

Health Minister launched Intensified Mission Indradhanush 2.0 portal

- Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare launched Intensified Mission Indradhanush (IMI) 2.0 portal in New Delhi.
- This portal start from December 2019-March 2020. The IMI2.0 is a rechristened version of mission Indhradanush Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) that aims to achieve 100% immunization.
- The portal was launched during the celebration of the silver jubilee of the Pulse Polio Programme.
- The health minister also launched Operational guidelines for 'Strengthening immunization systems to reach every child' and 'Operational guidelines for Strengthening Td10 and Td16 vaccine implementation.

eNAM for farmers' benefit

- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced states are being cajoled to reject the **Agricultural Produce Market Committees (APMCs)** and adopt electronic National Agriculture Market (e-NAM) so that farmers get better price for their produce.
- e-NAM is a pan-India electronic trading portal which networks the existing APMC mandis to create a unified national market for agricultural commodities.
- So far, 21 e-NAM mandis of eight states namely Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh had joined hands to start inter-state trade on e-NAM.
- Initially started with 25 commodities, e-trade facilities have been provided on 124 commodities with tradable parameters on e-NAM portal.
- The union finance minister also said that she had in the Budget announced formation of 10,000 Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) so that farmers have easy access to institutional finance.

Govt unveils IT initiatives for faster customs clearance

- The government unveiled two new IT initiatives, ICEDASH and ATITHI, for improved monitoring and pace of customs clearance of imported goods.
- These initiatives will also facilitate arriving international passengers with e-filing of baggage and currency declarations.
- Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman lauded the measures taken by the Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) to leverage technology for providing better taxpayer services

ICEDASH

- It is an Ease of Doing Business (EoDB) monitoring dashboard of the Indian Customs that will help public see the daily customs clearance times of import cargo at various ports and airports.
- It will help the businesses in comparing clearance times across ports and thus plan their logistics accordingly.
- It has been developed in collaboration with the National Informatics Centre (NIC).

SWAYAM 2.0

- Human Resources Development Minister Ramesh PokhriyalNishank will launch SWAYAM 2.0, Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds in New Delhi.
- The **SWAYAM programme** is initiated by the government to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy access, equity and quality.

Govt. launches ATITHI app for improved customs clearance

■ Union Minister of Finance and Corporate Affairs, Nirmala Sitharaman launched 'ATITHI' app, an IT initiative to facilitate electronic filing of customs baggage and currency declarations by arriving international passengers.

About ATITHI app

- ATITHI app is an easy to use mobile application for international travelers to file Customs declaration in advance.
- Passengers can use this app to file declaration of dutiable items as well as currency with **Indian Customs** even before boarding the flight to India.
- The ATITHI app has been introduced by CBIC (Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs). It is available on both, iOS and Android.

New facility for insect attack detection in plants by agro processor

- Edapadi Palanisamy has launched a new facility to detect insect attacks on plants by agro processor.
- Information technology projects developed by Tamil Nadu Electricity Agency have been launched.
- Accordingly, an e-attendance record has been created that will handle the arrival records in a simple manner, using facial recognition.
- The Tamil Nadu Electricity Agency has created a facility to analyze the photos uploaded by the tillage processor and identify the diseases and pests of crops.
- Farmers can get the fire by sending pictures to the tiller operator through a cell phone equipped with a camera.

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath launched e-Ganna app

- Uttar Pradesh government has launched a dedicated web portal and e-Ganna app for sugarcane farmers in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh. Through Online cane supply slip are obtained, and it will be issued by the sugar mills to the farmers.
- e-Ganna app provides the information regarding the cane survey, basic quota, bonding, cane calendaring, issuance of parchi is available in the single platform. The move is in line with Prime Minister Narendra modi's vision to double the farmers' income.
- Aim The web portal and e-Ganna App help to eliminating cane mafia and middleman and also to strengthen the cane development societies.

Tamil Nadu ministers launch app, portal to help farmers control pests

- The app and a portal providing geo-based agriculture information were launched by ministers of Tamil Nadu Thiru R B Udhayakumar, and Thiru R Doraikannu at the M S Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF).
- The app called PANNAI, (Pest-disease advance Notification and Need-based agriculture information) has been developed by MSSRF with support of Oracle CSR and technical inputs from Tamil Nadu Agriculture University (TNAU).
- It provides advance information on pestdiseases so farmers can protect their crops with Advisories, market information and farm-specific weather advisories are also available, something that is usually available only at district level.
- It also uses integrated information from the Uzhavan app of the Govt of Tamil Nadu.

Shaala Darpan portal for Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti launched

- The Union Minister of State for Human Resources Development Sanjay Dhotre launched the **Shala Darpan** Portal for Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti (NVS).
- Itisanend to ende-Governance school automation and management system for NVS.

What is Shala Darpan portal?

- It provides an integrated platform to meet the educational and administrative needs of all stakeholders (students, parents and teachers) and is capable of sending and receiving effective dialogue between every stakeholder.
- It will integrate all Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas with a common standard which includes around 636 schools and 2.67 million students.

CBI set up special unit to tackle Child Porn

Online Child Sexual Abuse and Exploitation (OCSAE) Prevention and Investigation Unit started by Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in New Delhi under the special crime zone to control the exploitation of child porn on Internet.

Key Points:

Aim – The aim of this "specialized unit" is to collect, collate and disseminate information regarding publication, transmission, creation, browsing, downloading, advertising, exchanging, distribution of information relating to online child sexual abuse and exploitation and investigation of such offences.



Indian scientists identify a protein that helps regulate blood sugar levels

- Scientists at the CSIR-Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology (CCMB) in Hyderabad have demonstrated the role of a protein secretagogin (SCGN) in increasing insulin action in obesity-induced diabetes.
- ▶ SCGN works as a functional insulin-binding protein with therapeutic potential against diabetes. SCGN binds to insulin and protects it from various stresses, increases its stability and adds to its action. Diabetes and neurodegenerative disorders such as dementia and Alzheimer's disease are often linked with each other. SCGN is found in lower quantities in the brains of Alzheimer's patients.

Swachh Survekshan Grameen Awards 2019

- The Union Minister of the Ministry of Chemical and Fertilizers, conferred the Swachh Survekshan Grameen 2019 awards to top-ranked states, union territories, and districts in the various categories on the occasion of World Toilet Day at Pravasi Bhartiya Kendra, New Delhi.

Government forms a Committee of Secretaries headed by Rajiv Guaba to study telecom sector's financial stress



The panel includes the secretaries to the ministries of finance, law, and telecom.

Ban on Bodo insurgents extended for 5 years

- The central government issued orders to extend the ban on Assam-based Bodo insurgent group National Democratic Front of Bodo land (NDFB) by another five years, citing that the terrorist outfit had continued to indulge in illegal and violent activities intended to disrupt the sovereignty and territorial integrity of India.
- NDFB has been engaging in unlawful and violent activities thereby undermining the authority of the Government of India and the Government of Assam and spreading terror and panic among the people, indulging in extortion of money from various sections of the society with a view to financing and executing its plans for the creation of a separate Bodo land and embarking on a systematic drive for recruitment of fresh cadres with a view to continuing its terrorist and insurgency activities.

India gets two new Union Territories in J&K, Ladakh

- Jammu and Kashmir, which has been part of the Union of India since 1947, ceased to be a state and was officially bifurcated into Union Territories.
- **RK Mathur,** the new and first Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Ladakh was sworn in by chief justice of Jammu and Kashmir high court Geeta Mittal in a simple ceremony.
- IAS officer Girish Chandra Murmu will take over as L-G of the UT of Jammu and Kashmir.
- Jammu and Kashmir was served a jolt in the form of the abrogation of Article 370, the strife-torn state ceased to exist.



- India now has two new Union Territories Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh while it has one less state.
- According to the Jammu and Kashmir Re-organization Act, 2019, the appointed day for the two UTs was on October 31

Himachal Pradesh: 2,000 Panchayats under Natural Farming

- Around 2,209 panchayats were brought under natural farming under **Prakritik Kheti Khushshal Kissan Yojana**.
- The State is promoting **Organic and Zero Budget Natural Farming** under the scheme.

Features

- Under the scheme, a target of **50,000 farmers** have been set for the year 2019.
- So far 20,579 farmers have been trained. Out of this, 15,391 are already practicing natural farming in their fields.
- The State Government plans to hold a minimum of 5 training sessions per month till March 2020.

Prakritik Kheti Khushal Kisan Scheme

- The scheme was launched by the Himachal Pradesh Government to promote natural farming and to increase farmer's income.
- The main objective of the scheme is to reduce costs required for farmers, increase farmers income and to reduce use of chemicals and fertilizers in the farm.

Delhi's average AQI in October less than last year

■ Delhi's air quality is back to square one - polluted. According to the Air Quality Index (AQI) bulletin released by the Central Pollution Control Board, Thursday was the most polluted day in October this year for Delhi-NCR. Delhi's air was less hazardous in October this year than it was last year. The average AQI for October 2018 was 285 which dipped to 239 this year. Though there is a drop of 46 points, however, the AQI still remains in the 201-300 zone -- maintaining its 'poor' status. An AQI between 0-50 is considered "good", 51-100 "satisfactory", 101-200 "moderate", 201-300 "poor", 301-400 "very poor", and 401-500 "severe". Above 500 is "severe-plus emergency" category. A "severe plus emergency" AQI essentially means that even healthy people may suffer from respiratory illnesses on prolonged exposure. This air will seriously affect those with ailments, according to a SAFAR advisory.

Tourism Ministry organising 8th International Tourism Mart 2019

- The 8th edition of 'International Tourism Mart' is being organized at Imphal, the capital city of Manipur from 23 to 25 November 2019. This annual event is organised in North Eastern region by Union Ministry of Tourism in association with North Eastern States. The theme for 8th International Tourism Mart is: 'Sustainable Tourism an engine for Economic Growth and Employment'.
- Manipur is hosting this mart for the second time. Earlier editions of this mart were held in Guwahati, Tawang, Shillong, Gangtok, Agartala.

President's rule revoked in Maharashtra

World's first CNG port terminal to be built in Gujarat

■ Gujarat government has given its approval to a Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) terminal facility at **Bhavnagar port**. This would be the **world's first CNG port** terminal. The approval for this was given by Gujarat Infrastructure Development Board headed by **Chief Minister Vijay Rupani**.

World's first CNG port terminal

■ Background: The Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB) had signed Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with UK-based Foresight Group to set up this port terminal at Bhavnagar in the Vibrant Gujarat Summit held in January 2019. The existing port at Bhavnagar is administered by Gujarat Maritime Board (GMB).

The check-ups include body mass index, blood pressure, body fat, haemoglobin, metabolic age, muscle mass, weight, height, temperature, muscle mass, basal metabolic rating, visceral fat, oxygen saturation, pulse rate, blood glucose, and bone mass. Health ATMs can be defined as private, walk-in medical kiosks with integrated medical devices for basic vitals, cardiology, neurology, pulmonary testing, gynaecology, basic laboratory testing and emergency facilities and staffed by a medical attendant.

NMCG organized 'Ganga Utsav' in New Delhi

■ India is on the top of the table of a clutch of countries in from southeast Asia — Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Mauritius. Bangladesh, which is second on the list of top five countries with diabetes (20-79 years), however, has only 8.4 million diabetics.

Govt sets up 3-member panel for division of assets, liabilities between J&K and Ladakh

- The Centre has constituted a three-member committee for division of assets and liabilities of Jammu and Kashmir between two successor Union territories, which came into existence on October 31.
- This was conveyed to members of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs by senior officials led by Union Home Secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla.

Andhra Pradesh government launches 'Nadu-Nedu' scheme

- Andhra Pradesh government has launched the 'Nadu-Nedu' programme.
- The programme aims to introduce English medium from classes 1 to 6 in state-run schools. The scheme will be implemented in 15,715 schools in the first phase. It will cover all schools in three years' time with a budget of ₹ 12,000 crores.

Property Owner - Tenant Agreement: Deadline extended by one year Emergency Act

■ The Government of Tamil Nadu has issued an Emergency Act, extending the deadline for contracting between property owner and tenants. The Emergency Act was passed on October 21, extending the contract deadline by a further 12 months. It has been announced that it will be approved at the next session of the legislative session.

IBM to launch a new weather forecasting system

■ IBM is to launch IBM GRAF, Global High-Resolution Atmospheric Forecasting System, which will be able to predict conditions up to 12 hours in advance. Such kind of precise forecasting system has been available in the United States, Japan, and some west European countries.

India seeking Israel help for 'tapwater to every Indian by 2024'

- India is seeking Israel's help to ensure functional tap-water to every Indian household by 2024 with a senior minister visiting the country next week to fulfill the government's mission. Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced that more than Rs 3.5 lakh crore will be spent in the coming years under the 'Jal Jeevan Mission' to bring piped water to households by 2024.
- The Jal Shakti minister will also be the keynote speaker for the prestigious biennial WATEC event. The Union Cabinet Minister is being accompanied by a large delegation from the states of Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Punjab and Delhi.

50th International Film Festival of India (IFFI)

The Information and Broadcasting ministry launched the official anthem and radio jingle for the golden jubilee edition of International Film Festival of India (IFFI), scheduled to take place in Goa. Rajinikanth, legendary actor will be honoured with a special award, 'Icon of Golden Jubilee of IFFI' while French actress Isabelle Hupert will be conferred the lifetime achievement award.

J&K: Administration to launch second phase of 'Back to Village programme'

■ The Jammu and Kashmir administration is all set to launch the second phase of 'Back to Village programme' to upgrade government websites with latest information from 25th to 30th November. The flagship programme is aimed at empowerment and development of Panchayats. It ensures the functionality of Panchayats in terms of manpower, 100% coverage of beneficiary oriented schemes and doubling of income of rural people by giving the impetus to the rural economy.

Delhi govt launched 'Mukhyamantri Septic Tank Safai Yojana' to eradicate manual scavenging

■ The Chief Minister of **Delhi** Shri Arvind Kejriwal has launched 'Mukhyamantri Septic Tank Safai Yojana', a scheme focused to eradicate manual scavenging in the state. As per this scheme, csitizens will be enabled to get their septic tanks cleaned for free using assistive technologies.

Key Points:

- The service can be availed by the citizens using a helpline number provided.
- Scheme coverage: The scheme will cover septic tanks without sewer lines, mostly build in unauthorized colonies.
- The government will hire an agency to clean the tanks and a tender will be floated within a month.

UNICEF Report: India Second largest in Pneumonia deaths

- United Nations' new report on Pneumonia stated that India has the second largest deaths of children under the age of five due to Pneumonia in 2018.
- Globally more than 800,000 children died due to Pneumonia under the age of 5.
- The report stated that though the disease is preventable through vaccines, more than 10 million die annually due to the disease

Highlights

- The five countries that were responsible for more than half of child deaths due to Pneumonia were Nigeria, India, Pakistan, Democratic Republic of Congo and Ethiopia
- Pneumonia is responsible for 15% of deaths in children under 5.
- The report named the disease as "Forgotten Epidemic"
- Around half of pneumonia deaths are associated with air pollution

Special Winter Grade Fuel launched for Ladakh Region

- Indian Oil Corporation launched special winter grade diesel that will remain unfrozen even at -33 degree Celsius.
- This will help to provide continuous and year-round access to the snow-covered regions.

Highlights

- The fuel meets BIS specification of BS-VI grade
- It was produced and certified at Panipat Refinery
- The winter grade diesel is to be supplied to the region from Jalandar in Punjab.

About winter Grade Fuel

- Diesel Fuel is prone to waxing in cold weather. Below its Cloud Point, diesel begins to form wax particles.
- Cloud Point refers to the temperature below which the fuel particles begin to cloud together and form solidified waxes.

Delhi is the world's worst polluted city

- Air pollution in Delhi has risen to its worst ever polluted city in the world
- Air pollution levels touched 527. It tops the list of the world's highest air pollutants. The list includes Hong Shu with 167 points, Vietnam's Hanoi with 182 points and Pakistan with Lahore at 193. But Delhi has 527 air pollution levels.
- According to **Skymet the overall Air Quality Index (AQI)** reading in Delhi this morning was 505 down marginally from 527.
- An AQI between 0-50 is considered good, 51-100 is satisfactory, 101-200 moderate, 201-300 poor, 301-400 very poor and 401-500 is marked as severe/hazardous.

Home Ministry, UN Women Launches Campaign to End Violence Against Women

- Union Ministry of Home Affairs in collaboration with UN Women launched an awareness campaign to end violence against women.
- As part of campaign a 'UNiTE to End Violence Against Women' Metro was flagged of at the Sultanpur Metro station in New Delhi.

'Indonesia ministries ban pregnant, LGBT job seekers'

Several Indonesian ministries banning pregnant, disabled, or LGBT job hunters in favour of what one called "normal" applicants, the Ombudsman announced that slammed as "arbitrary and hateful restrictions" by a rights group. The world's biggest Muslim majority country takes applications from millions of candidates who are applying for some 200,000 civil-service jobs nationwide. - The company is applying to the Monetary Authority of Singapore for a recognized market operator license and targets for the exchange to be fully operational in 2020.

Kishan Reddy to attend "No Money for Terror" conference

- Union Minister G Kishan Reddy will be representing India in the forthcoming "No Money for terror" conference to be held in Australia next week.
- There will be discussions on measures to control terrorism.
- As many as 70 countries have agreed to participate in the conference so far.
- Paris hosted the conference in April last year, he said adding India was ready to host the event in 2020.

Freedom on Net 2019 report-China the worst abuser of internet freedom

■ The Freedom of Netreport 2019 titled "The Crisis of Social Media" was released by the The Freedom House, an international watchdog. The report recorded an overall decline in global internet freedom status between July 2018 and May 2019. India obtained an overall score of 55 and was reported to be "partly free".

Highlights

■ Pakistan, with a score of 26, for the ninth consecutive year was declared as "not free" in terms of freedom status China obtained a score of 10 and was adjudged "not free". Ethiopia recorded the highest improvement in terms of internet freedom

Fire destroys 500-year-old world heritage site in Japan

- A fire has destroyed all the main structures of Shuri Castle, a Unesco World Heritage site on Japan's southern island of Okinawa.
- Shuri Castle, which was was once the seat of the Ryukyu dynasty, sits on top of a hill overlooking the city of Naha Okinawa's capital and is surrounded by curved stone walls.

Spanish capital Madrid to host COP 25

- The Spanish capital city of Madrid will host the UN Climate Change Conference (COP 25) from 2 to 13 December.
- The decision was taken following Chile's stepping down as host for the event due to the ongoing street protests in the South American country.
- The annual Conference of the Parties (COP) summit is a key event which allows representatives from around 200 nations to monitor and discuss the current situation of the world's warming climate.

Northeast India gateway to Southeast Asia under Act East Policy

■ Northeast India is being developed as a gateway to Southeast Asia under Central government's Act East Policy (AEP), and added that the plans are on cards to establish seamless connectivity between **Thailand**, **Myanmar and northeast India** in the years to come. This initiative will immensely strengthen India's act east policy and **Thailand's Act West Policy**. Integrated, strong and economically prospering ASEAN is in the interest of India," he announced during his address at the **16**th **India-ASEAN summit**.

India To Host No Money For Terror Conference Next Year

■ India will host the **No Money For Terror conference** to be held in 2020. The announcement made at the No Money For Terror conference in Melbourne, Australia.

No Money for Terror

■ The country decided to establish an informal network of FIUs for the stimulation of international cooperation. The countries which participated in the meeting should also effectively enforce the standards mandated by the Financial Action Terror Force (FATF) and UN listings. The members should initiate discussion on Countering Financing of Radicalisation (CFR), which would prevent radicalization - an essential prerequisite of terrorism.

■ The event includes discussions on topics as Azerbaijan's exemplary role to promote multiculturalism, tolerance and interreligious solidarity, Sheikhulislam Allahshukur Pashazade's contributions to the development of interfaith and inter-civilizational.

New Zealand: Allow for mercy killing

- A bill authorizing the death of a merciless killer of Tirasa sufferers was passed in New Zealand's parliament.
- Itisaworld-wideaffairthatcompassionately helps patients who are suffering from an incurable illness to take their lives.
- Opposition for mercy killing on religious grounds and for other reasons. However, the progressives claim that they will not allow them to die peacefully in advance, rather than die from pain and agony before they die.
- The bill was widely discussed throughout the country. So far, 39,000 people have registered their comments. Most of them commented on opposing mercy killing.
- In accordance with this bill, there are stipulations that the patient who is allowed to commit suicide with the help of a doctor or nurse must remain undiagnosed and die within six months.

India attends International Treaty of Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture

- India attended the eighth session of the International Treaty of Plant Genetic Resources for Food and Agriculture (ITPGRFA) at Rome, Italy.
- Agriculture Minister Shri Narendra Tomar attended the session representing India.
- The Treaty is in harmony with the Convention on Biological Diversity. The treaty was negotiated through FAO.

About the Treaty

■ It is also known as the "Seed Treaty". It is an international agreement to ensure food security by exchange of world's plant genetic resources of food and agriculture. It also aims at conservation and sustainable use of seed varieties.

India to host 19th Council of Heads of Governments of SCO in 2020

- India will be hosting the 19th Council of Heads of Government of the **Shanghai Cooperation Organisation in 2020**. This was informed by SCO Secretary **General Vladimir Norov**.
- This will be for the first time that India will host the high level meeting of the China-led eight-member economic and security bloc.

About SCO

■ Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) aka Shanghai Pact was created in 2001 in Shanghai by China. Apart from China, its founding members were Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. India and Pakistan were admitted as full members in 2017.

SCO summits

- SCO holds two types of summits every year viz. Summit of Heads of States and Summits Heads of Governments.
- These summits are organized in member states. The latest Summit of heads of government was held in **Tashkent** in November 2019.

TN became the first state to enact a law on contract farming

- President Ram Nath Kovind approved the Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce and Livestock Contract Farming and Services (Promotion and the first state to enact the law on contract farming.
- The Bill was adopted by the Tamil Nadu State government in February 2019. The Bill is first of-its-kind legislation that assures farm income.

Contract farming:

- Besides poultry, there was contract farming of sugarcane and herbs. But, until now, there was no law to ensure the welfare of the farmers involved in it.
- To benefit the marginal farmers, the Tamil Nadu state government came up with such legislation.

Amma youth sports scheme to be launched in Tamil Nadu


- The State government has sanctioned funds to the tune of ₹76.24 crore for implementing Amma Youth Sports Scheme.

No minimum qualification needed to get driving licence

- The Government has scrapped the requirement of an educational qualification to get a driving licence.
- The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways announced the move would benefit skilled people from economically underprivileged sections of the society.
- The Union government had amended the Central Motor Vehicle Act in 2007.
- According to Rule 8 of the Act, the minimum educational qualification to obtain a licence to drive a transport vehicle should be Class 8.
- According to the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, the driver must be able to read signs and perform logistical duty to report safety hazard.

Set up digital platforms to boost crop vield

- The Agriculture Department which recently succeeded in unveiling the Vivasaai App and e-thottam online portal, where farmers can directly sell their produce, has now bagged the prestigious Schoch award for IT-enabled services.
- The Chennai city police had bagged the Schoch award for its third eye CCTV camera project and now the state departments are working on improving the digital interface.
- The recently launched **Uzhavan mobile App** helps the farmers know about the agro-climatic conditions, stock position of critical inputs such as seeds, fertilisers and crop maintenance.
- According to State Planning Commission sources with land use cell, the state is now profiling the agricultural data related to TN districts and then the micro-level data on-farm practices and output yield will soon be tabulated.

'Red Atlas Map' unveiled for flood mitigation in Chennai

- Vice-President M Venkaiah Naidu unveiled the 'Red Atlas Action Plan Map,' a first of its kind ready reckoner, prepared by the Ministry of Earth Sciences to aid Tamil Nadu government in effective flood mitigation in Chennai which witnessed the worst deluge in 2015.
- The atlas, with probable scenarios for different rainfall periods, aims at flood mitigation, preparedness, operations and management aspects
- The atlas and the 'Coastal Flood Warning System App (CFLOWS-Chennai)', which was launched by the Vice-President are intended as decision support systems covering aspects, including preparedness and prevention.

Tamilnadu CM launches extended ambulance services for cattle

- Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami launched the extended Animal Medical Mobile Ambulance (AMMA) services at the Secretariat.
- The AMMA service was launched by former Chief Minister J Jayalalithaa in **2016.**
- In2016, Tiruchi, Thanjavur, Kanchipuram, Namakkal and Madurai districts were given two ambulances each.
- In a move to further extend these services,
 22 new ambulances at a cost of Rs 2.40
 crore were launched.
- The already existing toll free number 1962 can be contacted to avail the ambulance services.

TN inks pact with German bank for 2,713 buses

- The Tamil Nadu government signed an agreement with KfW, German Development Bank, for purchasing 2,713 buses for State transport corporations. Under the project of "Climate friendly Modernization of Buses in Major Cities of Tamil Nadu" an agreement has been signed for 203 Million Euro (Approximately ` 1606.47 crore) between State transport department and KfW.
- As per the agreement 2,213 BS-VI buses and over 500 e-buses would be purchased, in order to upgrade and modernize all Tamil Nadu State Transport undertakings.

CONNECT- 2019

- The 'Connect 2019' conference of the Indian Federation of Labor (CII) and Tamil Nadu Government started in Chennai. The two-day conference was inaugurated by K. Palanisamy.
- Tamilnadu is in the forefront of information technology. The various initiatives of the Tamil Nadu Government in every sector have been well received. According to a report released by Justice Aayok, Tamil Nadu is the second largest producer in India.
- The Government of Tamil Nadu is planning to implement 'BharatNet' project at Rs 1,815 crore to provide internet service to all villages.
- Thereby, 12 thousand 524 village panchayats in Tamil Nadu will be connected by glass fiber structure. This project will be implemented in the next one and a half years.

ADB to give \$451Mn for Chennai-Kanyakumari Industrial Corridor power links

- The Asian Development Bank will provide a \$451 million (appx. ₹3,200 crore) loan to strengthen power connectivity between southern and northern parts of Chennai-Kanyakumari Industrial Corridor (CKIC) in Tamil Nadu.
- As per ADB, the Manila-headquartered multilateral agency the total cost of the project is \$653.5 million, of which the government will provide \$202.5 million.

About Chennai-Kanyakumari Industrial Corridor (CKIC)

- On January 2019 Tamil Nadu Government passed a bill to amend Tamil Nadu Industrial Township Area Development Authority Act, 1997 (TNITADA) to turn CKIC project worth Rs.64.48 billion into reality.
- The first phase of CKIC project will have Madurai-Virudhnagar-Dindigul-Theni and Thoothukudi-Tirunelveli nodes. The focus of CKIC will be on manufacturing.

Artificial coral reefs at a cost of Rs 18 crore in the district waters affected by the Gaza Storm

- The Fisheries Department has decided to set up artificial coral reefs at a cost of ₹ 18 crore in the sea areas of the Gaja Storm.
- Artificial coral is a habitat and breeding ground for fish and other marine life.
- Therefore, artificial coral reefs are being set up in the seas around Tamil Nadu to feed the fisheries at sea.

Chief Minister lays foundation for international yoga centre at Chengalpattu Medical College

- For the first time in India a state-of-art International Yoga and Naturopathy Medical Science Centre will be set up at 50 acres inside the campus of Chengalpattu Government Medical College.
- Similar new hospital buildings were also inaugurated at the government hospitals in Karaikudi, Dharmapuri, Namakkal, Tirunelveli, Theni and Villupuram, involving a total capital outlay of Rs. 30.49 crore
- Mr. Edappadi K Palaniswami unveiled a plaque to lay the foundation stone for the proposed International centre at a function in the secretariat.
- The global centre is being built at a cost of `96.31 crore on a 50-acre land situated in the government medical college campus in Chenglepet, 60-km south of Chennai.

KONE inaugurates new Rs 450 crore manufacturing facility in TN

- Elevator and escalator manufacturer KONE inaugurated its new manufacturing facility at Sriperumbudur.
- The facility built at an outlay of around ₹ 450 crore would employ 600 people and serve Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan and Sri Lanka besides domestic market.
- The elevator manufacturing unit at Pillaippakkam, SIPCOT Industrial Park in Sriperumbudur is spread across 50,000 square metres.
- The plant is the largest in India, South and South East Asia.

Chennai police launch 'Thozhi' scheme

- The Chennai City police have launched a special wing called 'Thozhi' (friend) comprising women police personnel to support and provide counselling to victims and their parents in sexual assault cases (Pocso Act) and guide them through legal procedures.
- The City police commissioner A.K Viswanathan Friday launched on the scheme at the city police Commissioneratedisc and assigned 70 policewomen to work in the wing. They will be provided pink saris embedded with Nirbhaya logo as a mark of safety. Two policewomen will be assigned to each of the 35 all-women police stations in the city.

National Children's Science Conference at Kamaraj University

- The 27th National Children's Science Conference, jointly organized by Madurai Kamaraj University and Tamil Nadu Science Movement, was held.
- National Children's Science Congress (NCSC) is a nationwide Science Communication programme started in the year 1993.
