Telangana was carved out of Andhra Pradesh with Hyderabad as its capital as India's 29th state. Note 'Jaya Jaya he Telangana' was announced as the State Song of Telangana on June 2, 2024. The song was written by poet Ande Sri and the music was composed by M M Keeravani.
June 3	World Bicycle Day	 The day is observed on June 3 every year to spread awareness about the benefits of using bicycles. Theme 2024: "Promoting Health, Equity, and Sustainability through Cycling." The day was declared by the United National General Assembly in April 2018.

Note

- The offices of Speaker and Deputy Speaker originated in India in 1921 under the provisions of the Government of India Act of 1919.
- Article 93 of the Constitution states that the Lok Sabha shall choose two members to be its Speaker and Deputy Speaker.
- Frederick Whyte First Speaker of Central Legislative Assembly (1921)
- Vithalbhai J. Patel First Indian and the first elected Speaker of the Central Legislative Assembly (1925)
- G.V. Mavalankar First Speaker of Lok Sabha (1946)

iCET Meeting

- India-U.S. Initiative for Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET) dialogue was held recently in New Delhi.
- It was chaired by the National Security Advisers of India and US.
- The meeting was concluded with a bilateral agreement on furthering the cooperation on critical minerals between the two countries

Note

- A critical mineral is one which is essential for modern technologies, economies or national security
- India released a list of 30 critical minerals of India in July 2023.

About US

- Capital Washington.
- President Joe Biden
- Currency US Dollar

2.2 GOVT - WELFARE ORIENTED GOVT SCHEMES, THEIR UTILITY

Tele MANAS

- A memorandum of understanding (MoU) was signed between the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW) and Ministry of Defence (MoD) to facilitate collaboration between them in operating a special cell of Tele MANAS.
- Tele MANAS stands for Tele Mental Health Assistance and Networking Across States.

About Tele MANAS

- Launch October 2022.
- Implemented by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW)
- Objective To provide free 24X7 tele-mental health services.
- Implemented under National Mental Health Programme (NMHP).
- Toll-free number 14416.

Tuberculosis (TB) elimination

- India's goal to achieve the elimination of TB in the country by 2025 has slowed down.
- According to the Health Ministry, India has been engaged in TB control activities for more than 50 years, yet the disease continues to be the country's severest health crisis.

Note

- TB kills an estimated 4,80,000 Indians every year or over 1,400 patients every day.
- TB is bacterial disease caused by Mycobacterium tuberculosis.
- National Tuberculosis Elimination
 Programme (NTEP) is guided by the National
 Strategic Plan 2017–25 to accelerate the TB elimination.

National Health Claim Exchange (NHCX)

- It is a digital health claims platform developed About Assam by National Health Authority
- It will be jointly operated by the National Health Authority (NHA) and the Insurance > Governor - Gulab Chand Kataria Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI).
- Objective To serve as a gateway for exchanging claims-related information among various stakeholders in the healthcare and health insurance ecosystem.

Note

- Ayushman Bharat is an insurance scheme launched by the National Health Policy 2017.
- It was launched to achieve Universal Health Coverage (UHC).

PM Kisan Nidhi

- The Union government released the 17th instalment of the PM Kisan Nidhi scheme.
- The scheme is expected to benefit **9.3 crore** farmers and distribute around Rs.20,000 crore.

About PM Kisan Nidhi

- Launch February 24, 2019.
- **Objective** To supplement the financial needs of the farmers in procuring various inputs.
- Benefit Financial benefit of Rs 6000/- per year is transferred in three equal four-monthly installments

Mukhya Mantri Nijut Moina scheme

- The **Assam government** has announced the Mukhya Mantri Nijut Moina scheme recently.
- Under this scheme girl students enrolled in Class 11, the first year of a degree programme, and the first year of a post-graduate programme in government-run schools, colleges, and universities will be provided with a monthly stipend.

• It is a fiscal scheme for girl students which aims to prevent their early marriages.

- Capital Dispur
- Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma

Jan Aushadhi Kendras in Nepal

- Nepal has approached India to set up Jan Aushadhi Kendras in their country, which would allow their citizens to benefit from low cost Indian generic medicines.
- Mauritius is the first foreign country to adopt 'Jan Aushadhi Scheme'.

About Pradhan Mantri Bharatiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana

- Launch November 2008
- Launched by Department of Pharmaceuticals, Ministry of Chemicals & Fertilizers
- Objective To provide quality generic medicines at affordable cost.
- These medicines are distributed through 201 Pradhan Mantri Bharatiya Janaushadhi Kendras (PMBJK).

National Forensic Infrastructure Enhancement Scheme (NFIES)

- The Union Cabinet approved the National Forensic Infrastructure Enhancement Scheme (NFIES) with a total financial outlay of Rs. 2254.43 crore for the period from 2024-25 to 2028-29.
- The scheme will be implemented by the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- It is a Central Sector Scheme.
 - Components under this Scheme include

2.3 PUBLIC AWARENESS & GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

NOTA

- The Indore Lok Sabha constituency recorded more than 2 lakh votes polled for "None Of The Above" (NOTA).
- It is the highest number of votes that the "None Of The Above" (NOTA) option has ever received in any constituency till now.

Note

- Launch September 2013.
- The Supreme Court directed the Election Commission of India (ECI) to introduce NOTA.
- If the highest number of votes in a constituency is polled for NOTA, the second most successful candidate wins.

New Government

- President Droupadi Murmu formally invited Narendra Modi to form the new government for the third consecutive term.
- National Democratic Alliance (NDA) elected him as its leader.

Key Highlights

- NDA won 293 seats out of the 543 seats.
 - BIP 240 seats
 - Indian National Congress (INC) 99 seats
 - Samajwadi Party (SP) 37 seats
 - All India Trinamool Congress (AITC) 29 seats.
- Majority of 272 seats is required to form the government and none of the parties got the majority of seats
- NDA consist of Telugu Desam Party's (TDP) N.Chandrababu Naidu and Bihar Chief

- The Indore Lok Sabha constituency saw 218674 votes polled for "None Of The Above" (NOTA).
- The total number of women elected to Lok Sabha in this election 74 women make just 13.63% of Lok Sabha.
- According to Chief Election Commission, India created a world record with 64.2 crore voters, which includes 31.2 crore women voters.
- It is 1.5 times the voters of all G7 countries.

18th Lok Sabha

- Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju announced the First session of the 18th Lok Sabha will be held from June 24 to July 3.
- President Droupadi Murmu will address a joint sitting of the two Houses on June 27 under Article 86 and 87.
- The 18th Lok Sabha has 280 first time MPs and 74 women MPs.

Note

- **Article 86** confers a right on the President to address either House of Parliament or the joint sitting of the House.
- Article 87 provides two instances when the President of India specially addresses both Houses of Parliament.
 - Beginning of the first session of each year.
 - · Beginning of the first Session after each general election.



3. GEOGRAPHY

3.1 POLICY ON ENVIRONMENT AND ECOLOGY

The Red List of Ecosystems

- IUCN recently released the, "Red List of Mangrove Ecosystems".
- It is the first-ever global assessment of the mangrove ecosystems across the world.

Key findings

- 50% of mangrove ecosystems are at risk of collapse.
- By 2050 about 7,065 km2 (5 %) more mangroves will be lost and 23,672 km2 (16%) will be submerged due to sea level rise.
- Mangroves in coastal regions around Tamil
 Nadu, Sri Lanka and the Maldives were designated as 'critically endangered'.

Note

- The Tamil Nadu Forest Department has constituted 20 village mangrove committees to protect the mangrove cover.
- In Tamil Nadu, according to the Indian State
 of Forest Report, the extent of mangroves had
 doubled from 23 sq.km. in 2001 to 45 sq.km.
 in 2021.
- Mangrove restoration has been completed in 25 sq.km so far under the Tamil Nadu Coastal Restoration Mission.

Nitrous Oxide Emissions

 According to the study published in the journal Earth System Science Data, India is the world's second largest source of Nitrous Oxide (N2O).

- Nearly 11% of such global man-made emissions in 2020 were from India
- The major source of these emissions comes from fertilizer usage.
- N2O emissions from human activities have increased by 40% in the past four decades.

Note

 N2O is a greenhouse gas that heats up the atmosphere more than carbon dioxide.

E-flow Monitoring System

- Union Jal Shakti Ministry recently launched an e-flow (Environmental Flow) ecological monitoring system.
- It allows the real-time monitoring of water quality of Ganga, Yamuna and their tributaries and check performance of Sewage Treatment Plants (STPs)
- The system was developed by the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG).
- The system also monitors the activities of 'Namami Gange Programme'

Note

- NMCG (2011) Implementation arm of National Ganga Council (2016).
- 'Namami Gange Programme' (June 2014) An Integrated Conservation Mission with twin

objectives of effective abatement of pollution, conservation and rejuvenation of **River Ganga**.

Asiatic Lions

- The Forest Department in Gujarat has started translocating spotted deer (cheetal) and sambar deer from Gir Forest to the Barda Wildlife Sanctuary (BWS).
- This move aims to augment the population of prey for Asiatic lions in the wildlife sanctuary.
- Barda Wildlife Sanctuary is also located in Gujarat which around 100 kilometers far from Gir Forest.

Note

- Six Asiatic lions have migrated from Gir Forest to the Barda Wildlife Sanctuary (BWS) in 2023.
- In India, Asiatic Lions are found only in Gir Wildlife Sanctuary so far.
- IUCN Status Endangered

Culling of wild boars

- The Tamil Nadu government has decided to allow culling of wild boars that cause distress to farmers in farmland close to forest areas.
- The areas adjacent to reserve forests would be divided into three zones —
 - Zone A (within one km from forest limits)
 - Zone B (one to five km)
 - Zone C (beyond five km).
- Shooting of wild pigs will not be allowed within five kilometres from the reserve forest.

Note

- Vermins are placed in schedule V of the Wildlife Protection Act, 1972.
- The central government has the power to declare any wild animal as vermin under the
 62nd section of the Wildlife Protection Act

- India showed the best gender parity in terms of enrolment in secondary education.
- India ranked 65 globally on political empowerment of women.

Nanguneri Incident

- The one-man committee headed by retired Madras High Court judge K. Chandru has submitted its recommendations to the Tamil Nadu Government.
- The committee recommended that the Tamil Nadu government should prohibit the students in schools from wearing coloured wrist-bands, rings, or forehead marks that may indicate their caste.
- It also recommended the removal of caste appellations in the names of schools.

- It is a project proposed by the Tamil Nadu government for the conservation and rejuvenation of Cauvery river.
- In the first phase, the project would cover the river from downstream of the Mettur dam up to Tiruchi.
- In the second phases the remaining part of the river from Tiruchi to Poompuhar will be covered.

Note

- Poompuhar is Cauvery's confluence point with the sea.
- NRCD is a wing of the Ministry of Jal Shakti.

Maize Cultivation

- Minister for Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare M.R.K. Panneerselvam announced that the Tamil Nadu government would implement a special scheme to increase the area under maize cultivation in 18 districts at a cost of ₹30 crore.
- A kit with high quality maize seeds, natural and liquid fertilizers, and urea would be distributed to 50,000 farmers to increase the area by 50,000 hectares.

Note

- According to the action plan of the Agriculture Department for 2024-25, the government has set a target to increase the area under millets to 9.95 lakh hectares.
- The total food grains production target was 129.63 lakh metric tonnes for 2024-25.

Perumbalai Excavation

- Tamil Nadu Department of Archaeology recently released the report, titled 'Excavations' at Perumbalai 2022'
- The report was prepared by S. Paranthaman and R.Venkata Guru Prasanna.
- The report stated that Graffiti marks "resembling geometric symbols" were among the potsherds discovered.

 An unidentified copper coin and a copper bell were also discovered.

Note

- Kongumandala Satakam is a 13th Century literary work by Karmegakavirayar of Vijayamangalam. It refers to Perumbalai as the northern boundary of the Kongu region.
- Perumbalai is located on the bank of the Nagavathi (ancient Palar). It is one of the tributaries of Cauvery river.

School Education Department Initiatives

- School Education Minister Anbil Mahesh Poyyamozhi made many announcements regarding school education in the State Assembly. These include,
 - ₹58 crore had been allotted to upgrade the hi-tech labs in government schools.
 - ₹42 crore had been allotted for establishing hi-tech labs in government aided schools.
 - Committees consisting of teachers would be formed under the new Akal Villaku initiative to teach girls of Classes IX-XII to safely use the internet in an effort to protect them from physical, emotional and social disturbance.
 - A multi-sensory park will be developed in every district at ₹3.80 crore to improve sensitivity, intellectual motor skills, and muscular skills of children with disabilities.

Tamil Language Martyrs' Day

- Minister for Tamil Development, Information and Publicity, M.P. Saminathan announced in the Assembly that January 25 would be observed as 'Tamil Mozhi Thiyagigal Naal' (Tamil language martyrs' day) from 2025.
- He also announced that June 3, which is the birth anniversary of former Chief Minister and
- DMK president M. Karunanidhi, would be celebrated as 'Semmozhi Naal Vizha'

Other Announcements

- The works of renowned Tamil scholars such as Aru. Azhagappan, Ramalingam, So. Sathyaseelan, Ma. Ra. Arasu, Pavalar Sa. Balasundaram, Ka. Pa. Arayanan, Ka.Tha. Thirunavukkarasu, Ra.Kumaravelan and Kavignar Ka. Vezhavendhan will be nationalised at a cost of ₹91,35,000.
- 'Muthamizh Arignar Kalaignar' award would be instituted and will be given to those who contribute and work towards the **development** of Tamil language.
- A statue would be erected for Kavignar Mudiyarasan in Sivaganga district.

Statues to be built across T.N.

- Minister for Tamil Development, Information and Publicity, M.P. Saminathan announced
- that statues of famous personalities would be built across Tamil Nadu. These include
 - Rani Velu Nachiyar
 - Marudhu Brothers
 - Indira Gandhi Former Prime Minister
 - Sir.John Hubert Marshall Archaeologist instrumental in excavations of Harappa and Mohanjodaro sites of Indus Valley Civilisation
 - Bartholomew Siegenbaulk He brought the printing press to Tamil Nadu in 1713 and printed the Tamil translation of the Holy Bible.
 - G.D. Naidu
 - Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan.
 - Vai. Nadimuthupillai
 - C. Muthusami He was part of Cauvery Meetpu Kuzhu.

- Minister for Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare N. Kayalvizhi Selvaraj made some announcements regarding Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare in the Assembly which include
 - ₹20 crore would be set aside to enable landless SC/ST women who work as agricultural labourers to buy land.
 - · A centralised kitchen would be set up at a cost of ₹9 crore under 'Amudha Surabi' scheme in Tiruchi, Madurai, and Coimbatore.
 - Tribal boarding schools would be refurbished as per the demands and needs of the students.
 - The government would organise 'Lifestyle Festival' to celebrate the culture, traditions, literary works, linguistic based patriotism of the SCs and the STs.
 - 'Skill vouchers' would be given to SC/ST students who performed well in higher education at the cost of ₹41 lakh.

Tamil Nadu Lake Quality Monitoring Project

- The **Department of Environment and Climate (1)** Kulasekaran Commission on December 7, 2020 Change has announced the Tamil Nadu Lake Quality Monitoring Project recently.
- It will be implemented in water bodies through real-time monitoring and artificial intelligence (AI)-based data analysis.
- In the first phase, it will be implemented Poondi. Chembarambakkam. Udhagamandalam and Kodaikanal lakes at a cost of ₹5 crore.

Kallakurichi hooch tragedy

- Around 50 people died and many are admitted at the hospital after consuming spurious liquor.
- Tamil Nadu Government has constituted a one-man commission headed by former High Court Judge B.Gokuldas to inquire into the tragedy.
- Methanol has been cited as the cause of death
- The Food Safety and Standards (Alcoholic Beverages) Regulations 2018 stipulate the maximum permissible quantity of methanol in different liquors.
- The distribution of methanol is restricted by the Tamil Nadu Prohibition Act 1937.

Caste Census

 The Tamil Nadu Assembly unanimously adopted a resolution proposed by Chief Minister M.K. Stalin, urging the Union government to conduct a caste-based census along with the general population census.

Note

- The State could conduct a caste-based census under the Collection of Statistics Act, 2008, the Census Act could override it.
- Section 3 of the Census Act states that only the Union government could conduct a census.

- Census is covered under Entry 69 in the Union List.
- to collect caste based data.

Website for environmental volunteering

- A new website set to be launched by the Tamil Nadu government.
- The initiative aims to engage people in activities such as habitat conservation, beach clean-up and waste management.
- Initially, the scheme will be launched on the pilot basis.

International Airport at Hosur

- Chief Minister M.K Stalin made announcement that an international airport will be constructed in Hosur.
- It will be spread over an area of 2,000 acres.

Note

• The announcement was made under Rule 110 of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly.

WE-SAFE

- Minister for Youth Welfare and Sports Development Udhayanidhi Stalin unveiled Tamil Nadu Women Employment and Safety Programme (WE-SAFE)
- It would be implemented in the next five years (2024-29) at a cost of ₹1,185 crore.
- It would be implemented with the assistance from World Bank.
- Objective To increase the participation of the women labour force in non-farm and emerging sectors, to achieve a trillion-dollar economy by 2030.
- It will be implemented in eight districts initially.

Tamil Nadu Skills-Finishing Schools initiative

- launch of Tamil Nadu Skills-Finishing Schools initiative.
- It will be launched at the cost of ₹100-crore
- It will serve as a continuation of the Naan Mudhalvan Scheme.
- Aim To improve the skills of graduates seeking employment.
- The government also announced extension of in the Naan Mudhalvan Scheme to para medical courses.

About Naan Mudhalvan Scheme

- Launch March 2022.
- Aim To equip about 10 lakh youth across the State annually with skills.

Tamil Nadu Prohibition Act, 1937

- TN Chief Minister M.K. Stalin informed the Legislative Assembly that the Tamil Nadu Prohibition Act, 1937 will be amended to make punishments stringent.
- The Act aims to introduce and extend the prohibition of the manufacture, sale and consumption of intoxicating liquors and drugs in the State of Tamil Nadu.

Note

- Operation Ganja Vettai-4.0 Launched in April 30, 2023 to curb the illegal menace of ganja peddling.
- Tamilnadu State Marketing Corporation Ltd. (TASMAC) was established in 1983 to regulate the sale of alcohol and curb illicit liquor.

Announcements regarding Start-Ups

 Minister for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises T.M. Anbarasan announced a special seed fund will be introduced to support

- start-ups run by persons with disabilities and transgender persons.
- Tamil Nadu government announced the ** The beneficiaries would be identified by the Tamil Nadu Startup and Innovation Mission (StartupTN).

Other Announcements

- Regional start-up hubs would be established in Coimbatore and Tiruchi at a cost of ₹1.5 crore.
- Global Startup Coordination Centres would be established in Singapore and the U.S. at a
- cost of ₹1 crore.
- Thozhil Nayam A design studio to cater to the design needs of the start-ups will be established.
- The second edition of Tamil Nadu Startup Thiruvizha will be held in Madurai to generate market access and networking opportunities for the start-ups

Single-use plastic (SUP) items

- The Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) said that a total of 116.178 tonnes of banned single-use plastic items were seized in the special enforcement drives undertaken by local bodies between October 2022 and March 2024.
- In an effort to encourage the public to switch to cloth bags, the TNPCB installed manjappaivending machines at 174 locations including the Koyambedu Market.

Note

- India banned SUP items from July 1, 2022
- Tamil Nadu banned SUP items from January 1, 2019.
- Meendum Manjappai Launched in 2021 to promote the use of cloth bags by the public and discourage the use of plastic bags
