1.1 IMPORTANT DAYS

Date	Day	Theme / Remark
July 17	Martyrs Day	 July 17 is observed as Martyrs Day in Tamil Nadu. The day aims to honour the contributions of Thiyagi Arya (alias) Bhashiyam, Thiyagi Sankaralinganar, Thiyagi Shenbagaraman.
July 17	World Day for International Justice	 The day is observed on July 17 every year to promote International Justice. The day marks the anniversary of the Rome Statute on July 17, 1998. The International Criminal Court was established on July 1, 2002 on the basis of Rome Statute.
July 18	Tamil Nadu State	 July 18 is observed as Tamil Nadu State Formation Day from 2023. July 18 was the day on which a resolution moved by then Chief Minister C.N. Annadurai was adopted in the State Legislative Assembly to rename the then Madras State as Tamil Nadu in 1967. Note Madras State became Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Kerala on November 1, 1956
July 20	World Chess Day	 The day is observed on July 20 every year to commemorate the formation of International Chess Federation, FIDE in Paris in 1924. Note Chess is believed to have originated from Chaturanga of ancient India. The All India Chess Federation is the governing body for chess in India

Date	Day	Theme / Remark
July 20	International Moon Day (IMD)	 The day is observed on July 20 every year to honour the anniversary of the first landing of humans on the Moon. The day was declared on 9 December 2021 by the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA). The first landing of humans on Moon was accomplished by the Apollo 11 mission during which Neil Armstrong and Edwin 'Buzz' Aldrin set foot on the Moon's surface in 1969.
July 22	National Flag Adoption Day	 The day is observed on July 22 to commemorate the adoption of the National Flag by the Constituent Assembly in 1947. The National Flag was first designed in 1923 by Pingali Venkayya.
July 26	25th Anniversary of Kargil Vijay Diwas	 The day is observed every year on July 26. It is observed to pay tribute to the bravery of Indian soldiers who sacrificed their lives for the country during the Kargil War of 1999. The peaceful settlement of the Kashmir issue was concluded by the signing of Lahore Declaration in February 1999.
July 28	World Nature Conservation Day	 World Nature Conservation Day is observed globally on July 28 every year to emphasize the importance of preserving natural resources and protecting the environment. Theme 2024: Connecting People and Plants, Exploring Digital Innovation in Wildlife Conservation.
July 28	World Hepatitis Day	 The day is observed each year on July 28 every year to raise awareness on viral hepatitis. Theme 2024: 'One Life, One Liver'. About Hepatitis Hepatitis is inflammation of the liver. Viral hepatitis is the most common type and is caused by one of several hepatitis viruses A, B, C, D, and E.
July 29	International Tiger Day	 The day is observed every year on July 29, to raise awareness about the tigers. The day was first established in 2010 at the Saint Petersburg Tiger Summit. Theme 2024 : Call for Action

World Audiovisual and Entertainment Summit

- India will host the First World Audiovisual and Entertainment Summit (WAVES) in November 2024 in Goa.
- The event will be hosted alongside the **International Film Festival of India in Goa**.
- The event will help India to make a mark in the media and entertainment sector.

About International Film Festival of India

- Formation: 24 January 1952.
- Hosted jointly by the Government of Goa and the Directorate of Film Festivals

1.3 SPORTS

Paris 2024 Olympics

- The opening ceremony of the **Paris 2024 Olympics** has begun on the **Seine River in France.**
- Paris has already hosted the Olympic Games in 1900 and in 1924.
- 117 athletes from India will participate in the **Paris Olympics.**
- In Paris 2024, there will be 32 sports across 39 medal events.
- Each Olympic medal will have an original iron 2011 piece of the Eiffel Tower in it.

About Indian Contingent

- Out of the seven medallists from Tokyo 2020
 Olympics, Neeraj Chopra, Mirabai Chanu,
 PV Sindhu, and Lovlina Borgohain will participate in Paris 2024.
- **PV Sindhu and Sharath Kamal** are India's flag-bearers.
- Gagan Narang is the Chef-de-Mission of
 India's Paris 2024 Olympics contingent.

1.4 AWARDS AND HONOURS

Best Transgender Award

- Tamil Nadu chief minister M K Stalin recently presented the Social Welfare Department's Best Transgender Award for 2024 to Sandya Devi of Kanyakumari.
- She has performed more than 1,000 bow song performances creating awareness on Covid-19,

dowry harassments and violent against women.

A check of Rs 1 lakh and a certificate of appreciation are also presented to the awardee.

1.5 APPOINTMENTS

35th Foreign Secretary

- Vikram Misri was recently appointed as the 35th Foreign Secretary of India.
- He is appointed by the **Appointments** > Committee of the Cabinet (ACC).
- The foreign secretary ranks 23rd on the Indian Order of Precedence.

About Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC)

- Formation January 26, 1950
- Headed by Prime Minister
- Objective To appoint senior officials to key positions in the central government and public sector undertakings.

New Judges of Supreme Court

- President Droupadi Murmu recently appointed Justices N.Kotiswar Singh and Justice R.Mahadevan as Supreme Court judges.
- Their names were recommended by a five- 2.• Director General N. Kalaiselvi. member Supreme Court Collegium which is headed by the Chief Justice of India D.Y.Chandrachud.

Justice N. Kotiswar Singh is the first judge from Manipur to be appointed to the Supreme Court.

Note

- Judges of Supreme Court are appointed under the Article 124(3) of the Constitution.
- Total strength of Judges of Supreme Court : 34 (33 Judges + 1 Chief Justice)

CSIR chief

- Nallathamby Kalaiselvi who is currently the Director-General of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) was granted a two-year extension.
- She is the First woman Director-General of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR).

About CSIR

- Formation September 26, 1942
- President Prime Minister of India
- Headquarters New Delhi.

2.1 INDIA'S FOREIGN RELATIONS

India and Russia

- According to the Russia based Sberbank, India and Russia have doubled their payments in their national currencies (rupee-rouble).
- Rupee deposits by Indian corporates have also increased multifold in 2024 despite western sanctions.
- India and Russia have set a 100\$ billion trade target by 2030.
- The bilateral trade between **India and Russia** in 2023-24 is around \$65 billion.

India – Bhutan

- India has agreed to provide Rs 1,500 crore to Bhutan as part of the Economic Stimulus Programme in the next 18 months.
- The decision was taken in the 3rd India-Bhutan Development Cooperation Talks which was co-chaired by the foreign secretaries of India 7 and Bhutan.
- It is commonly called **'Plan Talks'** of the **13th Five Year Plan** which focuses on developmental cooperation and mutual interests.

- Since 20• Currencies Bhutanese Ngultrum, Indian Rupee.

2.2 RECENT COURT VERDICTS

SC Verdict on Tanti-Tantwa

- The Supreme Court recently quashed the 2015 Bihar government notification categorising Tanti-Tantwa community as Scheduled Caste.
- It ruled that states cannot make changes to the Scheduled Caste list published under Article 341 of the Constitution.
- The **Scheduled Castes list** can be amended or altered only by a law made by the Parliament.

• Neither the central government, nor the President can make changes without a law made by the **Parliament**.

Note

• Article 341 of the Indian Constitution authorises the President to declare certain castes and classes as Scheduled Castes in a state or a union territory.

2.3 GENERAL AWARENESS AND PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Money Bills

- Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud stated that a Constitutional Bench will be formed to address the petitions challenging the passage of Laws as Money Bills by the Central Government.
- Some of the legislations passed as Money Bills in the Parliament include:
 - Amendments to the Prevention of Money Laundering Act
 - The Finance Act of 2017
 - Aadhaar Act, 2016

The **Money** Bill question was referred to a seven judge Bench in **November 2019** by a **five-judge Bench** headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi in the case of Rojer Mathew vs. South Indian Bank Ltd.

Note

- A Money Bill is deemed to contain only provisions dealing with all or any of the matters under clauses (a) to (g) of Article 110(1).
- Article 110 deals with Money Bill and it can be introduced only in Lok Sabha.

2.4 GOVT. WELFARE SCHEMES

"One Scientist, One Product" programme

- The Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) launched the 'One Scientist One Product' recently on its 96th Foundation Day (July 16)
- One Scientist One Product Aims to improve research in the field of agriculture and animal husbandry.
- ICAR also announced the release of 323 varieties of 56 crops, including cereals, oilseeds, forage crops, and sugar cane.

 ICAR is also working on the initiatives -100 Days 100 Varieties and 100 Days 100 Technologies – which aims to introduce 100 new seed varieties and an equal number of farm technologies within a 100-day period.

3.1 POLICY ON ENVIRONMENT AND ECOLOGY

Tiger Deaths

- According to the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA), a total of 628 tigers died in India during the past five years due to natural causes and other reasons, including poaching, according to government data.
- 96 tigers died in 2019, 106 in 2020, 127 in 2021, 121 in 2022, and 178 in 2023.
- During 2012-2022, Madhya Pradesh (Bandhavgarh TR) reported highest number of Tiger death.

Tiger Conservation in India

- Project Tiger 1973
- **M-STrIPES** Digital monitoring system for more effective patrolling and data collection.
- National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) - To streamline the management of Project Tiger and numerous Tiger Reserves of India.

4. ECONOMICS

4.1 NEW ECONOMIC POLICY & GOVT. SECTOR

Model Skill Loan Scheme

- Skill Development Minister Jayant Chaudhary recently launched the revamped Model Skill Loan Scheme.
- The scheme was initially launched in **2015**.
- Earlier, only private, public and foreign banks, members of the Indian Banks' Association were eligible for facilitating loans.
- Under the revamped scheme, non-banking financial companies (NBFCs), NBFC-MFIs (micro-finance institutions), and small finance banks can also be lending institutions.





5. SCIENCE

5.1 LATEST INVENTIONS ON SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Chandipura Virus

- Recently there has been an increase in the cases of Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (AES).
- It is caused by the **Chandipura Virus**.
- According to data provided by the Union Health Ministry, so far, there have been 75 cases of AES reported from **Gujarat**, two from **Rajasthan** and one from **Madhya Pradesh**.

About Chandipura virus

• It causes the **inflammation of the brain**.

- The virus is also known as Chandipura vesiculovirus (CHPV) which belongs to Rhabdoviridae family.
- It was first identified in 1965 in Chandipura, a village in Maharashtra.
- Transmission: Sandflies and mosquito species such as Aedes aegypti are the vectors.
- Symptoms: Fever, vomiting, loose motion and headache

5.2 SPACE

Gaganyaan Mission

• Union Government informed the Parliament that one of the four astronauts undergoing training for **Gaganyaan mission** will travel to International Space Station as part of a collaborative effort with NASA.

² About Gaganyaan Mission

- Launch (expected) 2025
- Aim To to undertake human space flight mission to Low Earth Orbit (LEO).
- It will make India only the **4th country (after the US, Russia, and China)** that have launched crewed spacecraft.



6. NATIONAL – DIARY OF EVENT

Navi Mumbai airport

- Union Minister of State for Civil Aviation Murlidhar Mohol said that the new international airport in Navi Mumbai will be operational from March 2025.
- The airport which is currently under construction has been named after Dinkar Balu Patil.
- He was the leader of the Peasants and Workers Party of India.

Note

 The 4 International Airports in Tamil Nadu are Chennai, Coimbatore, Madurai and Tiruchirapalli.

Reconstitution of NITI Aayog

- The newly formed Union Government reconstituted the NITI Aayog.
- The term of the Aayog is **co-terminus with the term** of the **Union Government**.

About NITI Aayog

- Formation 2015
- Composition:
 - Chairperson Prime Minister of India
 - Vice-Chairperson Suman Bery
 - Governing Council.
 - Regional Councils
 - CEO BVR Subrahmanyam.
- Aim
 - To monitor the adoption of the SDGs in the country

• To promote competitive and cooperative federalism among States and Union Territories

Operation Nanhe Farishtey

 During last seven years (2018- May 2024), Railway Protection Force (RPF) has rescued 84,119 Children under the operation named 'Nanhe Farishtey'.

About Operation Nanhe Farishtey

- Launch 2018
- Aim To rescue children in need of care and protection across various Indian Railway Zones.

Naming of halls in Rashtrapati Bhavan

- **President Droupadi Murmu** has renamed two important halls at the **Rashrapati Bhavan**.
- Durbar Hall now set to be called Ganatantra Mandap.
- Ashok Hall to be called Ashok Mandap.
 - The Durbar Hall is the venue of key ceremonies and celebrations such as the presentation of national awards.
 - The Ashok Hall is used for presentation of credentials by Heads of Missions of foreign countries.

About Rashtrapathi Bhavan

- Inauguration 1931.
- Architects Edwin Lutyens, Herbert Baker

UNESCO World Heritage List

- The **Charaideo Moidams** was recently included in the list of **UNESCO World Heritage Site** as the **43rd site from India**.
- Charaideo Moidam is a 700-year-old moundburial system of the Ahom dynasty from Assam.
- It is the **first cultural site** to be added to the list from the **Northeast region**.
- They are famously called the "Pyramids of Assam."
- After Kaziranga and Manas National Parks, it is Assam's third World Heritage Site.
- The World Heritage Committee has inscribed
 1,199 sites in 168 countries on the list.

About UNESCO World Heritage Site

- It is declared under World Heritage Convention 1972.
- It established the framework to preserve the world's outstanding heritage

GROWTH-India Telescope

- Recently GROWTH-India Telescope captured a 116-meter, building-sized asteroid during its closest approach to Earth.
- The telescope was launched under **GROWTH-India Project**.
- GROWTH stands for Global Relay of Observatories Watching Transients Happen.

About GROWTH-India Telescope:

- It is India's first fully robotic optical research telescope
- Objective To observe explosive transients and variable sources, including near-Earth asteroids.

• It is located at **the Indian Astronomical Observatory site at Hanle, Ladakh**.

Secretary charge of External Cooperations

- Ministry of External Affairs criticized Kerala government's order appointing a Secretary in charge of External Cooperation, stating that State Governments should not intrude into matters that are beyond their constitutional jurisdiction.
- Constitutional provisions regarding External Affairs
- Seventh Schedule: Foreign affairs is placed • under Union List.
- Article 253: Parliament has power to make any law for implementing any treaty with any other country or any decision made at any international conference, etc.
- Article 293: Places restriction on the states to get foreign loans.
- Recently, Union Government informed the Parliament that under Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan (PMGDISHA), over 6 crore trained and over 4.7 crore candidates have been certified.

About PMGDISHA

- Launch 2017
- Implementing agency: CSC e-Governance Services India Limited.
- **Beneficiaries:** One person (age group of 14-60 years) from every eligible rural household.
- **Objective** To make 6 crore persons in rural areas digitally literate.

MANAS Helpline

- Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation Amit Shah chaired the **7th Narco** • It will help the citizens to connect with (NCB) Coordination Centre (NCORD) top-level meeting and launches the National Narcotics Helpline 'MANAS' in New Delhi.
- MANAS will include,
 - A toll-free number 1933
 - A web portal

- A mobile app
- UMANG app.

Narcotics Control Bureau 24x7 for seeking advice on de-addiction and rehabilitation, sharing information on drug trafficking.

ASEAN Foreign Ministers' meeting

- External Affairs Minister S.Jaishankar recently attended the opening session of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Foreign Ministers' meeting in Laos, Cambodia.
- He referred to the bloc as the "cornerstone" of India's Act East policy and Indo-Pacific vision.
- He also highlighted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 12-point plan for ASEAN and East Asia Cooperation platform.

About ASEAN

- Formation August 8, 1967
- Headquarters Jakarta
- Members 10

Note

- The **Act East Policy** focuses on the extended neighbourhood in the Indo-Pacific region, with **ASEAN** as its core.
- **12-point plan** aims to expand cooperation between **India and the ASEAN**





8. TAMILNADU AFFAIRS

Kalaignar Mahalir Urimai Thogai Thittam

- The Tamil Nadu government recently stated that it is taking steps to cover more women heads of families under the Kalaignar Mahalir Urimai Thogai Thittam.
- So far about **1.15 crore women** are covered under the scheme.

About Kalaignar Mahalir Urimai Thogai Thittam

- Launch September 15, 2023 in Kancheepuram.
- **Objective** To ensure a basic minimum income of Rs 1,000 per month for eligible women heads of families.
- Beneficiary Woman who has completed 21 years of age (born before September 15, 2002)

Language Atlas of Tamil Nadu, 2011

- Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India (RG & CCI) recently released the Language Atlas of Tamil Nadu, 2011.
- RG & CCI functions under the Union Ministry of Home Affairs.
- The Atlas has used the **2011 Census** data for Tamil Nadu for its analysis.
- The population of Tamil Nadu is **7,21,47,030** as per **2011 Census**.
- The Language Atlas of Tamil Nadu, 2011, is the **second State-wise language Atlas**.

Key Findings

- About **18.49**% of the total population in Tamil Nadu could speak **English**.
- About **2.11**% of the total population in the State could speak **Hindi**.
- The Five major languages, classified on the basis of the total number of speakers in the State, are Tamil (6,37,53,997), Telugu (42,34,302), Kannada (12,86,175), Urdu (12,64,537), and Malayalam (7,26,096).

Note

- The First edition of India's Language Atlas was published in 2004 using the 1991 Census data.
- The First State-wise Language Atlas was that of West Bengal which was published in October 2023.

Chief Minister's Breakfast Scheme

- Chief Minister M.K.Stalin launched the extension of Chief Minister's Breakfast Scheme to government-aided schools in Tiruvallur district.
- The event marked the birth anniversary of former **Chief Minister K. Kamaraj.**
- The scheme would benefit **2,23,536 students at 3,995** government-aided primary schools.

About Chief Minister's Breakfast Scheme

- Launch September 15, 2022
- **Objective** To provide breakfast to primary school children from 1st to 5th standard

studying in Government and Governmentaided schools.

Living Craft Treasure Award

- Chief Minister M.K. Stalin presented the Living Craft Treasure Award 2022 - 23 to eight crafts persons and the Poompuhar State Award 2022
 - 23 to 10 artisans.
- These awards are presented to crafts persons and artisans who have excelled in their respective fields.
- Living Craft Treasure Award carries a cheque for ₹1 lakh, a tamirapathiram, an eight gram gold medal and a certificate.
- Poompuhar State Award carries a cash prize of ₹50,000, a four gram gold medal, a tamirapathiram and a certificate.

Acting Chief Justice of Madras High

- Justice D. Krishnakumar has recently been appointed as the Acting Chief Justice of Madras High Court.
- Appointment of Acting Chief Justices is to be made by the President under Article 223 of the Constitution.

About Madras High Court

- Formation : June 26, 1862
- Jurisdiction : Tamil Nadu and Puducherry.

Tamil Nadu in SDG India Index 2023-24

- According to the latest SDG India Index 2023-24 Tamil Nadu took the third spot with a composite score of 78, surpassing the national average of 71.
- It was released by the NITI Aayog.
- It measures and tracks national progress of all States and Union Territories (UTs) on 70 targets and 113 indicators.

- Scores range between 0–100.
- States are divided into four categories under the Index: Achiever (100), Front runners (65-
- 99), Performers (50-64), and Aspirants (0-49).

Tamil Nadu's Performance

- It also retained its position as a **front runner**.
- Tamil Nadu is a **'front runner'** in 13 SDGs in the latest report.
- Achiever category in Affordable and Clean Energy (SDG – 7)
- Performer category in Gender Equality (SDG 5) and Life Below Water (SDG 14).

TN State Policy for Homeless Persons with Mental Illness

- Tamil Nadu is formulating a policy to streamline the processes involved in the rescue and rehabilitation of homeless persons with mental illness.
- The policy facilitates their reunion with family and reintegration into society.
- he policy will put in place structured services for the wandering mentally-ill.
- It defines the roles and responsibilities of the various stakeholders.

New India Literary Programme (Puthiya Bharatha Ezhutharivu Thittam 2022-27)

- The **School Education Department** has identified over six lakh illiterate people, aged over 15, across Tamil Nadu and has begun classes to provide them with basic literacy this year under **New India Literary Programme**.
- The top five districts with the highest enrolment ratio in the literacy programme
 - Krishnagiri 61,622
 - Salem 50,671

- Tiruvannamalai 37,971
- Madurai 28,472
- Erode 26,020
- It is expected to benefit over 30 lakh people across the State.

About New India Literary Programme

- Launch 2022-23 to 2026-27

- Tamil Nadu had achieved the Sustainable
 Development Goals (SDG) for maternal mortality which is to reduce global MMR to less than 70 per one lakh live births.
- Virudhunagar recorded nil maternal deaths from April 2023 to March 2024.
- Nearly 60% to 75% of causes for maternal deaths are connected to four risk factors
 - Pregnancy-induced hypertension
 - Postpartum haemorrhage
 - Sepsis
 - Unmet need for family planning service.

TN-RISE initiative

 Around 130 enterprises and start-ups from across Tamil Nadu which are led by women entrepreneurs will get mentored under the Tamil Nadu Rural Incubator and Start-up Enabler (TN-RISE) initiative.

UNION BUDGET 2024

- Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Union Budget 2024.
- This is her 7th Union Budget.
- The four main focus points of the first budget under the Modi 3.0 government includes,

 - Nari (Women)
- 9 priorities of Budget 2024:
 - Productivity and Resilience in agriculture
 - Employment and Skilling.

 - Next gen reforms.

Agriculture

- Allocation: Agriculture and allied sectors were allocated 1.52 Lakh Crore in the Union Budget 2023-24.
- Release of new varieties: The new 109 highyielding and climate-resilient varieties of 32 field and horticulture crops will be provided to the farmers.
- Natural Framing: In the next two years, 1 crore farmers across the country will be initiated into natural farming.

• An indigenous technology developed as a joint venture between NTPC and BHEL capable of producing **800 MW commercial plant.**
